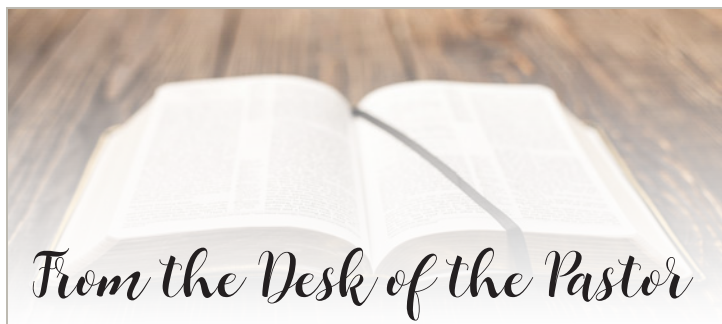

THANK YOU! At the end of 2025, I came to you, the parishioners of St. Patrick's, regarding our status for *The Appeal*, the diocesan campaign for various ministries throughout the Diocese of Columbus. You have always been generous in the past, and I knew that this year would be no different. The week before Christmas, we were still short of our goal of \$171,619.43. Thanks to you, and several year-end gifts, we now have \$184,494.58 paid, and \$230,434.00 pledged. I cannot thank you enough! With the surplus that has been paid, we can start collecting that as a rebate for St. Patrick's, and the money pledged above our goal is guaranteed to come back to our parish in full. Even though we have reached our goal, you can still help with *The Appeal* 2025. Any pledges and donations made until Easter will still be applied to the 2025 campaign, and at this point, it will all come back to St. Patrick's. I encourage you to give today. We have exceeded our goal at this point with pledges from about a quarter of the parish community. Imagine where we can be if every family in the parish gave, even just a little? No gift is too small or insignificant!

The surplus from *The Appeal* 2025 will help to cover the expenses of our next capital project - upgraded LED lighting in the church. This will enhance the splendor of our beautiful church and artwork, but we're not upgrading the lighting just so that the church looks nice. There is another, more pressing need: our current incandescent bulbs in the church are no longer manufactured. We can still order them, but once the last bulb burns out, we'll be in the dark! But we are people of the light - the light of Christ! I ask you to pray and consider how the Lord may be moving you to help with this important project, which will ensure that our church remains well-lit for many decades to come.

Last Saturday, we had a wonderful Volunteer Appreciation Dinner. Father Cornelius prepared a delicious prime rib, and it was a great time for those who have given of their time in the parish throughout the year. If you weren't able to make it, we certainly missed you, but we have a special gift for you to pick up in the Gallery: a copy of Fr. Peter John Cameron's book, *Made for Love, Loved by God*. For those who are thinking about getting more involved in the life of our parish: I encourage you to look into our many ministries within the parish; we are truly grateful for our volunteers!

We enter into Ordinary Time, the first part of a two-part liturgical season (which occurs between the Christmas and Lenten seasons, and again between the Easter and Advent seasons). However, we mustn't think of "ordinary" as usual or uneventful.

The context of the phrase "Ordinary Time" would best be described as "ordered time," seen in how each week of the season follows in sequential order (Second Week, Third Week, etc.). In Ordinary Time, we reflect on the full mystery of Christ, who was born in time in order to save us from our sins. As this season of Ordinary Time begins, I also want to use it as an opportunity for expanding some practices of the Roman liturgy at Masses with music.

### ENTRANCE ANTIPHONS

For several years, we have sung the proper Entrance Antiphon during the seasons of Advent and Lent. The antiphons are taken from the *Roman Missal* (and at Masses without music, they are simply recited before the Sign of the Cross). When sung, the antiphons incorporate different psalms as the verses. While we are used to this practice during Advent and Lent, Entrance Antiphons are not penitential in nature; if anything, they are preferred in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*. The practice of an Entrance Hymn, while laudable, is usually more proper to the Liturgy of the Hours rather than the Mass.

Last year, we continued the use of the Entrance Antiphons during the Easter season. Now as we enter Ordinary Time, I've decided to expand the use of the Entrance Antiphons, beginning with the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time and running through the Easter season. This will give us four months as a parish to assess this practice, before making it permanent. On certain special feast days (especially Christmas and Easter), we will still have Entrance Hymns, which will be followed with the chanted Entrance Antiphon (without psalm verses). As we become more accustomed to this practice, I encourage you to remember that the practice of Entrance Antiphons with psalm verses is what the Church envisions for the celebration of the Mass. During my own formation in seminary, we would sing them on Sundays at the Dominican House of Studies. I know that a number of parishes have also begun singing the Entrance Antiphons on a regular basis here in the Diocese of Columbus.

### INCENSE

One practical aspect of the Entrance Antiphon is that it gives the priest ample time to process to the sanctuary and incense the altar. While we have had incense at most of our Masses with music, the 9:00 a.m. Mass usually didn't have incense. Over the last year, we have used it on certain occasions, notably feast days when we use solemn torches. Now as we move toward singing the Entrance Antiphons, we will also use incense at all Masses with music. On weekends, this includes the 5:00 p.m., 9:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and Noon Masses. Special celebrations (such as Candlemas, the St. Patrick Vigil, Confirmation, and First Communion) will also have incense. The 7:00 a.m. Mass and weekday Masses will continue to be incense-free, since they do not have music.

### CLOSING MUSIC

As we've implemented the new diocesan directive on the St. Michael Prayer (and its practical application following Masses

with music), this will give us some flexibility on the closing music of Mass. Since we'll be singing Entrance Antiphons regularly, I don't want to lose the possibility of a hymn at the close of Mass as well. With this in mind, we will still sing the seasonal Marian antiphon on occasion (at least once a month), while also incorporating recessional hymns at the end of Mass. We will also have instrumental pieces on some other weekends. During Lent, our recessional will be silent. This will allow us to conclude Mass with an appropriate piece of music, and then enter into silence after Mass for a time of prayer and thanksgiving, which is the Bishop's desire.

With these liturgical adjustments, my hope is that there will be consistency between Masses with music and Masses that do not have music, while respecting the liturgical norms of the Church and the devotion practices of the people of God. My sincere thanks goes to Kathleen Tully, our director of music, whom I have worked with on these adjustments. Kathleen does a remarkable job leading our choir, and all our musicians are to be commended!

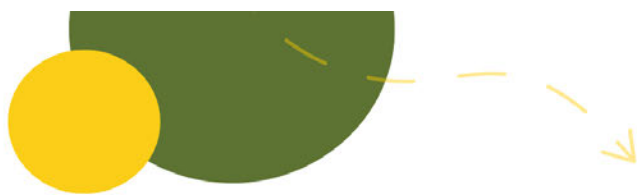
