

This past week, I've been on my annual retreat, returning once again to the Priest Retreat House at the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Hanceville, Alabama. Over the last few years, I've taken my retreat in the early summer, but due to my new duties as prior, I will have to be away for most of June at our Provincial Chapter in Providence, Rhode Island. I started to look at the calendar for 2026, and it became hard to find six straight days where there wasn't a meeting, a special event, or some other commitment that needed my attention as either pastor or prior. And then I saw an open week in mid-January, so I set it aside to make my retreat for the year. Perhaps it's best to start off the year with a retreat, so we'll see if this becomes my new trend. You were remembered in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament while I was on retreat, and I pray that this new year will be a time of great blessing for you and your families.

Our Respect Life Ministry has also been on the road over the last week, making the annual pilgrimage to Washington, D.C. for the March for Life. This trip is an important act of prayer, sacrifice, and witness on behalf of life, as we work to protect the lives of the unborn. A special word of thanks goes out to Lorraine Vance, for her careful planning of the trip, and to Gabriel Vance, the head of our Respect Life Ministry. Even if you can't make the annual pilgrimage to Washington, I encourage you to get involved locally with our Respect Life Ministry. Consider signing up for a holy hour of Eucharistic adoration on the third Friday of the month (which continues into the early morning hours of Saturday). This time of adoration is set aside to pray for life, and though a holy hour in the middle of the night may be hard, it is also a sacrifice for the unborn. Adoration concludes with Benediction before the 7:00 a.m. Mass, and following Mass, the Respect Life Ministry hosts a social, before going to pray the Rosary outside a local abortion facility. All are invited to pray and witness on behalf of life.

Father Cornelius met up with the group at the March for Life, as he takes some time away after Christmas to visit our friars in Washington and Baltimore, and to attend this Saturday's solemn profession of three of our Dominican brothers. As January draws to a close, it's hard to believe that we're starting to look ahead to Lent! I'm happy to announce our preacher for this year's Lenten Parish Mission: Fr. Joseph-Anthony Kress, O.P. Father Joseph-Anthony is no stranger to St. Patrick's, as he spent the summer of 2012 here as a student brother, working at Vacation Bible School. He is a native of St. Clairsville, Ohio, and a fellow graduate of Franciscan University of Steubenville (he was two years behind me). His parents now live in Powell, so they will be glad to have

him home for the better part of a week. You may know Fr. Joseph-Anthony from the podcast *Godsplaining*, which he and a number of Dominican friars host each week. Father Joseph-Anthony currently lives at St. Vincent Ferrer Priory in New York, where he serves as Promoter of the Rosary for the Dominican Province of St. Joseph. Mark your calendars for our mission: March 2nd-4th. Father Joseph-Anthony will arrive early to preach at all the Masses on the weekend of February 28th and March 1st.

Don't forget about this Saturday's Trivia Night, hosted by the St. Patrick's Fellowship. This is always an exciting event for our parish community, and this year will be no different! Be sure to sign up before it's too late. A special word of thanks goes out to Amy (Hughes) McCoy and her team for organizing this year's Trivia Night. The Fellowship is looking for more volunteers to help with our parish social events, so be sure to meet Amy at Trivia Night and let her know if you'd be interested in helping with this important parish ministry.


