One man who would say "Thanks be to God!"; enrollment in the Angelic Warfare Confraternity available after all Masses this weekend in honor of St. Thomas Aquinas

Dear friends,

As Catholics, we know by heart that after the Scripture readings at Mass, we have a certain response: "Thanks be to God" or "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ." Like any words we say often from memory, we can easily miss their significance.

There are other events in our life that are "Thanks be to God" moments. Finding a child who was lost ("Thank God you're home safe!"), passing a punishing exam, seeing a player on your favorite football team run a kick return back for a touchdown ("Praise you, Jesus!")

But imagine if you were the man possessed by an unclean spirit we heard about in the Gospel. Imagine that you were completely overcome by an evil influence in your life; a power so strong that you would lose all control of yourself as this evil influence caused you to stand up and start shouting, making a scene in the local synagogue where you came to worship, hoping that somehow this evil might be overcome and cast out of you forever. Imagine the times that this slavery would lead to shame, and countless whispers of pity behind your back when it became painfully clear to everyone around you that you were as limp as a rag doll under the power of this evil.

Imagine how, then, you might feel as a result: Powerless? Despairing? Living in fear?

And then imagine that one day, a certain Jesus of Nazareth was invited to teach at your synagogue. The evil spirit used you yet again to make a scene. All eyes were upon you, and you didn't even have the strength to ask Jesus for help. Then, the words of power came from the mouth of this teacher from Nazareth, and the evil spirit left you with a great noise and convulsions—but it finally left you. Forever.

If I were that man, I would be more than ready to say, "Thanks be to God!" "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!"

Why? Because the power of these words of Jesus had a real effect in my life, to set me free from evil and let me live the life God created me to live.

Whenever that event was recalled, or retold, I would say in my heart, "Thanks be to God!" "Praise be to you, Lord Jesus Christ!"

News of this miracle travels quickly.

This is the first miracle recounted in the Gospel of Mark. By his words of teaching and command, he begins to establish the Kingdom of God, and to remove the evil forces that stand in its way.

What happens after this? The report of this authoritative teaching and exorcism spreads quickly, and many others *listen* to it.

Some people were lucky (or blessed) enough to witness the healing of the man in the synagogue with their own eyes. But many others who did not see it, heard news of it from witnesses, and hurried to find Jesus, to bring to him their own friends, neighbors, and family members who needed healing. By evening of that very day, the whole town came to Jesus. They dropped whatever they were doing, and brought their suffering to the feet of Jesus of Nazareth. And he healed them. And surely they said, "Thanks be to God!"

We are like those townspeople of Capernaum. We (probably) haven't witnessed the miracles of Jesus with our own eyes, but we have heard about them from witnesses; from a sacred testimony that goes all the way back to the eyewitnesses of his miracles.

From a chronological standpoint, that event may seem far removed from us. But from a spiritual standpoint, Jesus is still with us. He still speaks with authority and power through his word. So we say, "Thanks be to God!" "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!"

The Catholic Church, in the Second Vatican Council, could not be more emphatic about the living power of Jesus' word:

From Dei Verbum #21:

For in the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven meets his children with great love and speaks with them; and the force and power of the Word of God is so great that it remains the support and energy of the Church, the strength of faith for her sons, the food of the soul, the pure and perennial source of spiritual life. Consequently, these words are perfectly applicable to Sacred Scripture: "For the Word of God is living and efficient" (Heb. 4:12) and is "able to build up and give the inheritance among all the sanctified" (Acts 20:32; cf. 1 Th. 2:13).

Note the setting of the Gospel reading: in a synagogue, a place of teaching and *listening*; a place where the people of God are *formed by the word of God*. Jesus does this to the full. Jesus not only teaches them with authority, he also swiftly overpowers the forces of evil.

In the end, no one can defy the Word of God. It is the message of good, the message of truth, the message of restoration of all that has been twisted and broken and wounded by sin and the power of evil.

But in the meantime, like the people of Capernaum, we come to worship on the Lord's day, to listen to his word—passed on to us by witnesses—and to be touched with his power through that Word and through his body and blood in the Eucharist.

Our first reading and Responsorial Psalm today also speak of the power of listening to God's Word:

Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Moses foretells a coming prophet from among the kin of the people; "to him you shall *listen*." The people had requested not to hear the awesome and fearful voice of the Lord again, accompanied as it was by the great fire at Mount Horeb. So God promises to put his words into the mouth of the new prophet, who shall relay God's commands to them. "Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it."

Psalm 95

Oh, that today you would hear his voice:
"Harden not your hearts as at Meribah,
As in the day of Massah in the desert,
Where your fathers tempted me;
They tested me though they had seen my works."

Surely the man who was set free of the unclean spirit continued to come to the synagogue, to be formed by the Word of God, to be continually refined, healed, forgiven, made strong. So do we!

We have the gift of hearing this word. We can respond in faith by letting this word form us, shape us, heal us, and set us free for the life that God has created us to enjoy.

Let us pray:

Jesus, help me to listen to your word; to understand what you want me to hear; to be sanded, shaped, and polished by your word.

Your word builds confidence; builds hope, builds faith. It strengthens the fearful and the despairing.

Your word reassures us of the direct connection you have with us; a real and living connection.

Help me to listen and respond to your powerful and living voice, speaking to us with love—again and again, so that I can say with my heart, "Thanks be to God!" "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!"

In honor of Saint Thomas Aquinas, whose feast day is January 28, enrollment in the Angelic Warfare Confraternity will be available after all weekend Masses. The AWC is a spiritual community of Christ's faithful for the pursuit and promotion of the virtue of chastity. Men and women are enrolled in order to receive assistance from God in the chaste life, under the patronage of St. Thomas Aquinas and the Blessed Virgin Mary. Each member of the AWC wears either the cord or

the medal of St. Thomas, and says daily prayers to receive the special graces that the Lord pours out through the Confraternity. The Confraternity is an apostolate of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), and is directed by the friars of the Order. It has existed in various forms from the 15th century, and was officially established in 1727 by Pope Benedict XIII.

Saint Thomas Aquinas, pray for us!


