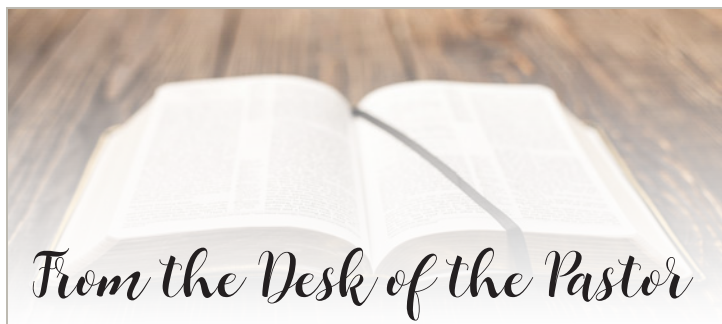

I love the Olympics! I think it's the gathering of so many nations, or perhaps their rarity (since they don't happen every year) which make them so fun to watch. Hopefully, you've had a chance to tune in to the Winter Olympics currently taking place in Milan, and perhaps you saw in the news a couple weeks ago that Columbus will be hosting some of the soccer tournament games for the 2028 Summer Olympics. How cool is that – Olympic events in our very city!

While the coverage of the Olympics may be focusing on Milan for its winter sports or fashion designers, we can't overlook its Catholic heritage. Milan was the city of St. Ambrose, the great doctor of the Church who baptized St. Augustine (and there is an area in the lower level of the famous Milan Cathedral which is believed to be the spot of that baptism!). Over 1,000 years later, St. Charles Borromeo served as archbishop there, as he ushered in a number of reforms following the Council of Trent (notably the seminary system for educating priests). Seminarians, as well as students and alumni of St. Charles Preparatory School, turn to him as their patron. In more recent decades, Pope St. Paul VI was serving as Archbishop of Milan before his election to the papacy in 1963. And we can't forget Leonardo da Vinci's famed fresco of *The Last Supper*, which is in Milan. But it's not just anywhere in the city: it's in the old Dominican priory! In fact, one section of the painting (near the feet of Jesus) is missing, because a doorway was cut into the wall by a Dominican prior who thought the artwork didn't have any value, and it could afford to lose a section. I promise – I won't be destroying any sacred art in our church or priory!

While the Olympics give us a chance to see the athletes of the world at their best, it is also a good reminder for us as we prepare for the start of Lent on Wednesday. During the opening prayer for the Mass of Ash Wednesday, we will hear Lent described as a "campaign of Christian service." We're setting out on a mission, a quest, not too different from the athletes who are pursuing victory. But it doesn't come to us easily – there is heavy discipline involved, just like the athletes in their training. We must endure suffering and self-denial. Saint Paul draws this metaphor in his first letter to the Corinthians: *"Do you not know that the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize? Run so as to win. Every athlete exercises discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we an imperishable one."* (1 Corinthians 9:24-25). As we embark on the discipline of Lent, we do so with Jesus. Our penances allow us to be conformed to His Cross – but through them all, He wins the victory of salvation

for us! We won't win a gold medal, nor even silver or bronze, but we'll receive something far greater: the promise of eternal life! May Lent not be a time to be dreaded, but a privileged time of grace which we will embrace.

Speaking of the beauty of our church, I wanted to share some exciting news about an opportunity given to St. Patrick's. A couple weeks ago, a representative from the Augustine Institute reached out to me about the possibility of filming a video series in our church. You may be familiar with the Augustine Institute from FORMED.org, as well as a number of other Catholic books, courses, and media which they produce. The recent SEEK conference brought our parish into the spotlight, and now the beauty of our church will be shared in an upcoming production. They will be here for three days in the middle of May to film a catechetical series for Confirmation preparation. It will be exciting to see St. Patrick's in a new video series that will be used in parishes across the country!

What is Fasting and Abstinence?

Fasting is the limitation of food, allowing a person to eat one full meal and two smaller meals, with no solid food in between. The two smaller meals combined should not exceed the amount of the full meal. All Catholics ages 18-59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence prohibits the eating of meat (beast or fowl), though eggs, milk, and cheese are permitted. All Catholics from age 14 onward are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

Easter Duty Obligation

Each of the faithful, after having received their first Holy Communion, is obliged to receive Holy Communion during the Easter season (Canon 920). This is traditionally linked to the requirement to confess grave sins at least once a year (Canon 989).

St. Patrick Stations of the Cross

St. Patrick's offers Stations of the Cross on Fridays of Lent at 7:00 p.m., immediately following the Knights of Columbus Fish Fries.

Eucharistic Adoration at St. Patrick's

St. Patrick's offers Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday from 12:15-8:00 p.m., a holy hour on Fridays from 12:15-1:15 p.m., and all-night adoration on the third and fourth Fridays of the month. Additional times for adoration will be scheduled during the parish mission and Holy Week.

40 Days of Adoration

The Diocese of Columbus sponsors *40 Days of Adoration* annually, in which every parish is asked to hold Eucharistic adoration on a day during the season of Lent. Our parish participation day will be February 27th and 28th.

Confessions

In addition to regular confession times, each Wednesday evening of Lent, St. Patrick's will offer confessions in the Gallery Confessional:

- February 18 – 7:30 p.m. (after Ash Wednesday Mass)
- February 25 – 7:00 p.m.
- March 4 – 7:30 p.m. (after the Parish Mission)
- March 11, 18 and 25 – 7:00 p.m.
- April 1 – 7:30 p.m. (after Solemn Vespers)

There will be no confessions on Palm Sunday, Holy Saturday, or Easter Sunday.

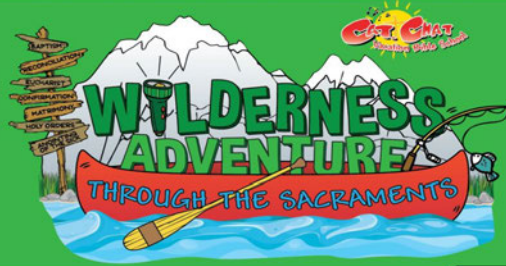
