This weekend, we are honored to welcome Fr. Basil Cole, O.P., to St. Patrick's. Father Basil was a professor and spiritual director at the Dominican House of Studies for many of us friars, and he will be preaching at all Masses this weekend, and will deliver the 2nd Annual Aquinas Lecture on Tuesday evening.

Father Basil is a native of San Francisco, and received his doctorate in sacred theology (S.T.D.) from the Angelicum in Rome. He has had an extensive career in teaching, and is a noted writer and speaker on moral theology and bioethics. In 2024, Father Basil received the Master of Sacred Theology (S.T.M.), the highest academic degree bestowed by the Dominican Order (with prestige higher than a doctorate!). At nearly 88 years young, Father Basil isn't slowing down, continuing to preach parish missions and teach classes (and did I mention that he's a jazz pianist?!). A few months ago, he offered to come and preach at St. Patrick's, and there was no way I could turn down a visit from such an esteemed Dominican friar! I thought that giving this year's Aquinas Lecture would be the perfect fit for this accomplished professor!

Father Basil's lecture on Tuesday night is titled, "Pull the Plug! It's a Waste of Money: Moral Guidance on Difficult Medical Decisions." He will be examining a number of topics regarding end-of-life care, and Catholic teaching on these matters. I think it is a very timely topic, as many in our world today see those who are sick or elderly as a burden, and measure care based on cost rather than caring for the human person. In a number of countries, and now states throughout our country, euthanasia has been legalized. Father Basil's talk will give us a number of insights on how we can respond to secular arguments in support of euthanasia, while helping us deepen our understanding of Catholic teaching on the dignity of the human person and end-of-life care. Everyone is invited to attend the 2nd Annual Aquinas Lecture this Tuesday at 7:00 p.m. in Aquinas Hall, and light refreshments will be served following the presentation.

Believe it or not, next Sunday is the final Sunday before Lent! We've been collecting old blessed palms in the Gallery all month, and next weekend, we will burn those palms in preparation for Ash Wednesday. All are welcome to come to a special palm burning ceremony in the parish center courtyard after the Noon Mass. This will be a chance for one last celebration before entering into Lent.

FRIENDLY REMINDER: NEW PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING MASS INTENTIONS

Please remember that the Dominican friars have adjusted the process for requesting Mass intentions. Mass intentions may no longer be scheduled over the phone or by email but must be made in person at the parish office or mailed to the office (with the check for the stipend). Mass intention requests without a stipend will not be scheduled until the stipend has been received, and stipends can no longer be paid by credit card or through *WeShare*. Checks should be made out to: "Dominican Friars" or "St. Patrick Priory." Individuals are limited to requesting six (6) Mass intentions for parish Masses in the church, but may request an unlimited number of private Masses offered in the friars' chapel in the priory. Finally, the Mass book for 2026 will not be opened until September of this year, in order to accommodate better planning for Mass novena intentions and the Mass intention requirements of the friars (such as the weekly Mass intentions for the people of the parish, or for the deceased Dominicans).

OFFICE PERSONNEL UPDATE FROM FATHER PAUL

Once again, our parish office will be going through some turnover. Susan Krumlauf, who joined us in November as our new Office Administrator, has accepted a new position at Ohio Health; her last day at St. Patrick's was Friday. We wish Susan well on her new endeavor!

After 42 years with Susan Livingston in the parish office, we're realizing just how invaluable she was to our parish, and all the work that she did! The recent turnover of secretaries has caused us to redistribute duties that Susan used to do, and the latest resignation has made us re-evaluate how we could best structure the office personnel.

With this in mind, I am happy to announce that Patti Phillips, who has worked at St. Patrick's part-time for 12 years as an office support member, will move to a full-time position as the Office Manager. However, Patti will not be working the reception desk regularly, as Susan Livingston did in the past. Patti will continue her invaluable work maintaining our parish census, database, and registrations, as well as helping Frank Hartge, our business manager, with envelope management. Patti will also oversee the sacramental records (which she has been doing recently) and oversee our great team of office support staff. She will be the main contact person for room reservations and scheduling at the parish (this will be important for ministry leaders or other volunteers to know as we go forward).

While Patti may step in at the reception desk as needed (as well as on certain Saturdays), her work will mostly be done at her office in the back of the parish office suite. At the reception desk, we will have a number of office support staff members, all with different duties, working on various days throughout the week. Sheila Tuttle, who has been working as the Sunday receptionist for many years, will be working on Tuesdays and Thursdays as well. She will also be responsible for maintaining orders for the office, sacristy, and pantry supplies (which will be important for ministries to know, if they use the kitchen regularly). Keelin Johnson, who has been working as the Saturday receptionist for the last several months, will continue this work, as well as her fine work as the bulletin editor (bulletin announcements should always go to Keelin, not the main office).

This leaves us with an open position - we are hiring a part-time administrative assistant, who can work at the reception desk on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. Our new team member will carry out all necessary reception duties and will also be the parish coordinator for safe environment (working closely with the Safe Environment Office at the Diocese of Columbus). This new job was posted this week. If you're interested, or know someone who is interested, consider applying today. Contact our business manager, Frank Hartge, for more information.

One major change with this new shift of personnel is that the office will close on weekdays at 2:00 p.m., instead of 3:00 p.m. We apologize for any inconvenience. These new hours mean that the office will have consistent hours seven days a week: 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. In the interim, there may be some days when the office will be closed until we have a full team in place. Please bear with us through this time of turnover.



CATHOLIC FOUNDATION AWARDS GRANTS!

On January 28, Christy Stephy, one of the Development Officers of the Catholic Foundation, presented checks to Fr. Paul Marich, O.P. and Fr. Thomas Blau, O.P., for the grants awarded by the Foundation in the recent 2024 Responsive Grants cycle.

Parish Center Roof Replacement

The parish is facing the necessity to replace the roof on the Parish Center in 2025.

The roof had been installed in 2003 with the new construction of the parish center, reportedly with 50 year shingles. Over the last several months, as an increasing number of leaks were developing in the 20-year-old parish center roof, different roofers were summoned to investigate. Each firm reported the original roof installation was faulty and not enough ventilation had been provided. Thus, the roof has over-heated for 20 years making the shingles brittle, causing their failure.

Additionally, the priory roof is over thirty years old, and in need of replacement.

The total cost of replacing the two roofs will approach \$200,000.00.

We applied for a grant from the Catholic Foundation to assist in the funding of this important and expensive project, and were awarded \$10,000.00, for which we thank the Foundation.

Barnabas Ministry

Many diocesan priests encounter difficulty when they desire to take vacation, attend a retreat, or take sick days. They often have to call 10 to 15 priests to find someone to cover for the sacramental schedule of their parish (or multiple parishes).

The Barnabas Ministry was started by Fr. Thomas Blau, O.P., a Dominican friar well known to members of St. Patrick's. His goal is to make the task of finding coverage for Masses and confession times much easier for the priests of the Diocese of Columbus. With one call to Fr. Thomas, if the dates are open on his schedule, the diocesan priest can get coverage for a day, a week, or longer if needed. Fr. Thomas ensures that the parish's sacramental schedule can be maintained during a parish pastor's absence.

The Diocese of Columbus pays Fr. Thomas a salary to keep him "on retainer", thus no fee is required of the parish which he helps. But his insurance – health, dental, and auto-related – is not covered and is a significant expense to St. Patrick Priory. The Catholic Foundation awarded a grant of \$20,000.00 to cover these expenses.
