Special appeal this weekend for Diocese of Columbus seminarians: Susan Livingston retiring at the end of April

#### Dear friends,

The two main aspects of Bishop Fernandes' vision for our diocese are Evangelization and Vocations. He has encouraged us to pray and work for these priorities. We are blessed by God to have a much larger than usual entering class of seminarians: 16 young men entering this year. To put this in perspective, there were only 18 seminarians in total when Bishop Fernandes came to the diocese in Spring 2022.

This blessing also brings some practical costs, though. The Diocese had not budgeted for this many seminarians entering in a single year. So, even though this is a particularly good problem to have, we are asking you to help with their formation expenses in a special appeal this weekend.

In today's Gospel, the Lord took Peter, James, and John "up a high mountain apart by themselves." It was during this experience that the disciples were brought into deeper intimacy with Christ, heard the Father speaking to them from heaven, and were prepared for their struggles ahead, especially the passion and death of Christ before his glorious resurrection. In a similar way, the seminary is meant to be a breaking from the world for a time, so that the seminarian can be immersed in the life and mind of Jesus Christ, to grow more sharply attuned to the voice of God in his life, and to be strengthened for the mission he will receive at his ordination to the priesthood. We as a Church provide the resources necessary to allow a man to step away from the world for a time to study for the priesthood without overburdening his family financially as a result, especially since each seminarian is being formed not for his own sake but for the life and health of the Church.

We presently have four men from St. Patrick parish in formation for the priesthood for the Diocese of Columbus: Rev. Mr. Tyler Carter and Rev. Mr. Michael Haemmerle (who will be ordained to the priesthood this May), Shane Gerrity, and Shawn Caslow.

Shawn Caslow, a seminarian who converted to Catholicism as an undergraduate student at OSU, and who considers St. Patrick his home parish, will be speaking at the beginning of each Mass this weekend to share about his vocation story and ask for your prayerful and financial support. Thank you in advance for any help you can provide to these young men who are discerning and following a call to serve our diocese as priests after the heart of Jesus Christ.

When I asked herin order to draft a job description for her successor—to kindly make a list of all that she does at St. Patrick, the list went on for pages. ## A Brief Examination of Conscience

Based on the Ten Commandments

### I am the LORD your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.

Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

### You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

#### Remember to keep holy the LORD's Day.

Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation (Jan. 1; the Ascension; Aug. 15; Nov. 1; Dec. 8; Dec. 25)? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

#### Honor your father and your mother.

Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

#### You shall not kill.

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?

#### You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

#### You shall not steal.

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?



Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation

### You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

#### You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

#### You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

#### Christ's Two Commandments

How well do we love God and others? Do we love as Christ calls us to? In the Gospel of Matthew, Christ gives us Two Commandments: "He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments'" (Mt 22:37-40).

Not sure what love is? St. Paul describes it for us in his Letter to the Corinthians. Is this how you love God and others? "Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quicktempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails" (1 Cor 13:4-8).

#### **ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT**

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk, or cheese.

#### **FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of Fast and Abstinence (ages 18-59).

#### FRIDAY STATIONS OF THE CROSS 7:00 P.M.



The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross or Via Crucis, commemorate Jesus' passion and death on the cross. There are fourteen stations, each depict a moment on his journey to Calvary through sacred art, prayer, and reflections. The practice began as pious pilgrims traced Jesus' path through Jerusalem on the Via Dolorosa. Later, for the many who wanted to pass along the same route, but could not make the trip to Jerusalem, a practice developed that eventually took the form of the fourteen stations currently found in almost every church throughout the world.

#### Giving Yourself Away: A Lifetime Project #3

**How much should we give to parish offertory?** This is a question that is asked by many people entering the Roman Catholic Church during the RCIA process. Many are coming from the Protestant tradition in which they belong to small churches owned by the congregation. So, their sense of ownership and responsibility for the church building, bills, and pastoral staff is often stronger than Roman Catholics with (typically) diocesan-owned buildings. Our new members simply want to know how to plan their charitable giving to the church.

What are the expectations? There is a formula that provides guidance, but it is not without problems. First, the formula, then the problem. Reasonably, if you take the # of households in a congregation and divide that into the annual parish budget you might come up with a "fair share" number. For instance, if a parish has 1,000 households and the budget is \$1,000,000 annually (nice round number, here), each household's "fair share" would be \$1,000/year. Divide that by 52 weeks, it amounts to a weekly contribution of \$19.23 per household. Here is the problem, though. Not all parishioners contribute. So, often the participating number of households defaults to one-third of those households donating about two-thirds of the total parish income, one-third giving a third, and the remaining third of the households donating little to none. That is the problem. In this scenario, if two-thirds of the parish households give the "fair share," but 1/3 does not contribute anything, the annual income actually declines.

Our parish is dependent on the generosity of those who can, and do, give more than a fair share. We are grateful for their generosity. At the end of the day, it is a freewill offering - tithing is not an expectation. However, given the reality of parish participation, it is worthy of consideration to contribute more at Mass when the Bread of Heaven is offered, than what we spend at the local drive-through!
