

From the Desk of the Pastor

This Tuesday, we are very blessed to have Fr. Humbert Kilanowski deliver our 3rd Annual Aquinas Lecture. Father Humbert is no stranger to St. Patrick's, having been a parishioner here when he was a graduate student at Ohio State, before entering the Dominicans in 2010. He received his Ph.D. in Mathematics before entering the Order, and since his ordination in 2018, he has been teaching mathematics at Providence College in Rhode Island. He's been living in the priory since mid-December as part of his year-long sabbatical, and he will be with us until Holy Week. Having a professor from Providence College in the priory gave us the chance to have him deliver this year's lecture. However, Fr. Humbert won't be teaching a math lesson; he'll be putting his theological training to good use by offering a talk on the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. I encourage you to join us, especially if you have children making their Confirmation this year. The Aquinas Lecture, held around the traditional Feast of St. Thomas Aquinas (March 7th) is an opportunity to remember the legacy of Aquinas High School, in which a visiting friar, usually a professor, delivers a special presentation. This is the third year for this event, so we hope it continues well into the future.

Father Humbert is one of the many sons of St. Patrick Parish who has responded to the Lord's call to be a priest, and I pray that there are many more to come. Back when Fr. Humbert was a novice in Cincinnati in 2011, I was a student brother, and I was blessed to come to St. Patrick's for my summer assignment (as one of the "V.B.S. Brothers"). During that summer, I met one of the teenagers from the parish, who was helping with Vacation Bible School. He was only 14, but had a maturity beyond his years, and a great personality which made him wonderful with people of all ages. He also showed his Irish sense of humor, which made some of us friars ask, "Who is this kid?" followed by, "He'd be a great priest!" Later this week, that young man will take a major step on his vocational journey. We as a parish are overjoyed for the diaconate ordination of Shane Gerrity, who has grown up from that teenage volunteer, and who will now dedicate his life to the Lord Jesus Christ. On Saturday at 10:00am, he will be ordained a transitional deacon by Bishop Fernandes at St. Joseph Cathedral. Everyone is most cordially invited to attend the ordination! Next Sunday, Deacon Gerrity will assist at the 9:00am Mass and preach his first homily, and a special reception will follow in Patrick Hall. At the reception, I'll be presenting Shane with a gift from St. Patrick Parish: his amice, alb, and cincture, the three vestments that deacons and priests wear under their stole and chasuble (or the dalmatic, for deacons). Deacon Gerrity will use these gifts

throughout his diaconal and priestly ministry, and we as a parish are happy to help him, as we have supported him throughout his journey. Congratulations to Deacon Shane Gerrity, and to his parents Pete and Karen, and his brothers and sisters and extended family, on this momentous occasion. And we look forward to his priesthood ordination, God-willing, in May 2027.

Now my question for families in the parish is this: Who is the next vocation? A call to the priesthood and religious life is nurtured in the home and in the parish. As I work with our altar boys, I see the potential for many priestly vocations among our young men. And I'm sure the Lord is calling a number of young women to consider the religious life. Please pray for vocations! Encourage our young people, whether in your own families or within the parish, to pursue the Lord's call.




**Mass begins at 6:30 p.m. followed by festivities until 10:00 p.m.

All parishioners, family, and friends are invited to our celebration in honor of St. Patrick to ask the intercession of our heavenly patron for blessings on our parish and the blessing of peace in Ireland and throughout the world.

Plenary Indulgence: One can obtain a plenary indulgence by a visit to a parish church on the feast of its patron. The conditions for receiving the indulgence are that during the visit, one must offer prayers for the pope (the Creed and the Our Father) and within 20 days make a Sacramental Confession and receive Holy Communion.



What is Fasting and Abstinence?

Fasting is the limitation of food, allowing a person to eat one full meal and two smaller meals, with no solid food in between. The two smaller meals combined should not exceed the amount of the full meal. All Catholics ages 18-59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence prohibits the eating of meat (beast or fowl), though eggs, milk, and cheese are permitted. All Catholics from age 14 onward are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

Easter Duty Obligation

Each of the faithful, after having received their first Holy Communion, is obliged to receive Holy Communion during the Easter season (Canon 920). This is traditionally linked to the requirement to confess grave sins at least once a year (Canon 989).

St. Patrick Stations of the Cross

St. Patrick's offers Stations of the Cross on Fridays of Lent at 7:00 p.m., immediately following the Knights of Columbus Fish Fries.

Eucharistic Adoration

St. Patrick's offers Eucharistic adoration every Tuesday from 12:15-8:00 p.m., a holy hour on Fridays from 12:15-1:15 p.m., and all-night Adoration on the third and fourth Fridays of the month. Please see the Holy Week Schedule for adoration times during Holy Week.

Confessions

In addition to regular confession times, each Wednesday evening of Lent St. Patrick's will offer confessions in the Gallery confessional:

- March 11, 18 and 25 – 7:00 p.m.
- April 1 – 7:30 p.m. (after Solemn Vespers)

Please see the Holy Week Schedule for additional confession times during Holy Week.

There will be no confessions on Palm Sunday, Holy Saturday, or Easter Sunday.

Ohio Knights of Columbus Announce Tour of Blessed Ulma Family and Blessed Michael McGivney Relics During Lenten Season of Sacrificial Love

Knights of Columbus throughout the Diocese of Columbus, OH will host a tour of Blessed Ulma Family and Blessed Michael McGivney relics from **March 13 – 15**, inviting the faithful to prayerfully reflect on family, sacrifice, and mercy, especially during this holy season of Lent.



Sacrificial Love of the Ulmas

The Blessed Ulma Family of Markowa, Poland, were a husband and wife with six children and a seventh in the womb, who were martyred by the Gestapo in 1944. Jozef and Wiktoria Ulma built a domestic church rooted in Scripture, prayer, and an expansive understanding of love. When Jewish neighbors came to them in desperation—the Goldmann family and others—the Ulmas did not deliberate. They opened their doors. Wiktoria bought extra food for the families they were hiding, and when questioned, she answered simply: *It's for the children*. In that quiet phrase lives the entirety of Catholic social teaching—that every human being, born and unborn, known and unknown, is a child of God deserving of protection. In their family Bible, the Ulmas had underlined the question from Luke's Gospel: *Who is my neighbor?* (Lk 10:29). Beside it, in Polish, they had written a single word: tak—yes. When warned that harboring Jews would bring death, Józef Ulma refused to abandon them. His fidelity cost him everything. On March 24, 1944, the Gestapo executed the Jewish families first, then Józef and Wiktoria, and finally all six of their children. During the execution, Wiktoria's unborn baby was partially delivered—a child whose birth in death led the Polish bishops to recognize the

youngest martyr in the history of the Catholic Church, baptized in the blood of its mother.

Father McGivney would have recognized the Ulmas immediately. His entire apostolate was built on the conviction that the family is the first cell of the Catholic Church and that its protection is sacred work. For Father McGivney, who founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882, the neighbor was the widow too often left destitute by her husband's death in the factories, the orphan with no provisions, and the immigrant family isolated by language and prejudice. The Knights of Columbus became his instrument of mercy — a fraternal order dedicated not to prestige but to charity, unity, and the defense of family life.

What began as a small fraternal benefit society has since grown into the world's premier lay Catholic men's organization, with more than 2.2 million members in over 16,800 local councils - but its animating principle remains unchanged: love your neighbor, protect the family, and do it in the name of Christ. Today, the relics of both Blessed Michael McGivney and the Blessed Ulma Family travel for the first time together, carried by Father Jonathan Kalisch, O.P.


