

Dominican Friars



As the season of Lent begins, it is important for us to remember the penitential aspect of this holy season. We practice penance through prayer, fasting, and works of mercy (almsgiving). We also should use this season to make a good confession before the celebration of Easter.

At St. Patrick's, the sacrament of penance is offered each day: on weekdays, after our 11:45 a.m. Mass until the line ends, on Saturdays for one hour before the Vigil Mass, and on Sundays for 30 minutes before each Mass. The demand for confession has increased over the years, that now two priests are scheduled to hear confessions on weekdays and Sundays (and on First Fridays and the days right before Christmas and Easter, we'll have three or more). Several priests will be on to hear confessions on Holy Thursday and on Good Friday, and this year, we're trying something new: Wednesday evening confessions (usually starting at 7:00 p.m.), for those who may not be able to get here at midday, or who have difficulty getting to confession on Sundays. The Wednesday evening confessions will be heard in the newly restored Gallery Confessional (since the church is often in use at this time for choir practice), but it will also give an opportunity for those who are mobility impaired to use the handicap accessible confessional.

As you prepare for confession during the season of Lent (or anytime of year), I wanted to share a couple of catechetical points to remember, so that you can make a good confession:

- Confession ought to be preceded by an examination of conscience: come prepared to confession! Using the Ten Commandments or an overview of the virtues and Beatitudes are usually helpful in making your examination.
- When starting your confession, tell the priest how long it has been since your last confession, and if it would be relevant to the confession, your state in life ("I'm a husband and father," "I'm single," "I'm a consecrated religious"). This helps give the priest the necessary context for hearing the confession.
- Start by confessing all of your mortal sins (the kind of sin and the approximate number of times committed). This is what is required for a valid confession. After that, confess any venial sins (which don't have to be confessed in the sacrament, but it is a good practice to do so). Prioritize the

time you have in the confessional by getting the big things out first!

- Remember the conditions for a mortal sin: it is a sin of grave matter (typically a direct violation of the Commandments or something very harmful to God, self, or neighbor), done with full knowledge (you know what you're doing is wrong), and full consent of the will (but you decide to do it anyway). Venial sins either lack gravity, or something is impeding your knowledge of the sin (such as invincible ignorance, when you really didn't know something was wrong and had no way of knowing) or your consent of the will (when your will is impeded, such as being in a state of sleep or doing some action by force from another).
  - It's important to remember that confession is not spiritual direction or counsel it's a sacrament, and Christ and the Church only require you to confess your sins, not the context of other difficulties going on in life. If the priest needs greater context to understand more clearly what you're confessing, he'll ask you. The priest may offer a few words of counsel to help you in fighting sin, but if you are in need for spiritual counsel regarding a particular or ongoing difficulty in life (which is not sinful), it would be best to meet with a priest to discuss this outside of confession (especially on Sunday mornings, when the priests need to hear a large number of confessions in a short amount of time).
- While the priest does not always need the greater context of what's going on in your life for a valid confession, the circumstances of a sin may impact the gravity of your sin, and should be mentioned (for example, there's a big difference between stealing \$5 from your sister, and robbing \$1 million from the bank!).
- If you are aware of a mortal sin on your soul, refrain from going to holy communion until you have gone to confession.
- If you have a confession of only venial sins (usually called a "devotional confession"), it is perfectly fine to do this at any time (weekdays or weekends). However, if you only have venial sins on your soul, there is no prohibition to go to holy communion (in fact, the reception of holy communion forgives any venial sins on our souls!).
- After the priest has given you your penance, make your act of contrition (either the traditional act, which is printed in the confessionals, or another prayer which expresses your sorrow). Then the priest will give you absolution.

- Go and fulfill your penance as soon as possible!

May this season of Lent truly be a time of grace for you, especially through the penances we undertake and in the sacrament of penance!

#### Days of Universal Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. Anyone over the age of 18 and who has not yet reached their 60th year is obliged to fast and abstain. Fasting is the limitation of food and drink permitting a person to eat one full meal and two smaller meals with no solid foods in between.

#### All Fridays of Lent are Days of Abstinence

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk, or cheese.

#### Weekdays of Lent

There is no obligation to fast on weekdays of Lent. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

#### **Easter Duty Obligation**

Each of the faithful, after having received their first Holy Communion, is obliged to receive Holy Communion during the Easter season (Canon 920). This is traditionally linked to the requirement to confess grave sins at least once a year (Canon 989).

#### St. Patrick Stations of the Cross Fridays of Lent at 7:00 p.m.

#### Eucharistic Adoration at St. Patrick's


St. Patrick's offers Eucharistic Adoration every Tuesday from 12:15-8:00 p.m., a holy hour on Fridays from 12:15-1:15 p.m., and all-night Adoration on the third and fourth Fridays of the month. Additional times for Adoration will be scheduled during the parish mission and Holy Week.

#### 40 Days of Adoration

The Diocese of Columbus sponsors *40 Days of Adoration* annually, in which every parish is asked to hold Eucharistic Adoration on a day during the season of Lent. At St. Patrick's, our parish participation day will be March 28th-29th.





#### WHAT IS LENT? March 5-April 17, 2025

Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. ... In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholic.
