Happy Laetare Sunday! We've reached the midpoint of our Lenten season, and we wear rose today (NOT pink!) as a sign of our joy that this time of penance has reached a turn; it is an oasis in the desert of Lent. And believe it or not, we are now only two weeks away from Holy Week. This year for Holy Week, we will be reviving a practice, and adding a couple new practices, which I hope will become new traditions at St. Patrick's. Hopefully, these will make our celebration of Holy Week and Easter more grace-filled and prayerful:

One Preacher for the Seven Last Words — This is a revived practice, which seems to have stopped around the time of the pandemic. For the Meditations on the Seven Last Words on Good Friday between Noon and 3:00 p.m., one visiting Dominican friar will preach all the meditations. This will allow the friars from St. Patrick's to hear confessions uninterrupted throughout the afternoon, and since the meditations are being delivered by one preacher, it will almost be like a "mini-parish mission" on Good Friday. This year, I'm happy to announce that Fr. Patrick Briscoe, O.P., editor-in-chief of Our Sunday Visitor, and the preacher of our 2023 Lenten parish mission, will be coming back to St. Patrick's to preach on the Seven Last Words of Christ. Father Patrick loves our parish, and actually asked me if he could preach during the Triduum; how could I refuse the generosity of such a great preacher! Father Patrick will also preach the homily for the Celebration of the Lord's Passion at 3:00 p.m., which will cap off his earlier meditations throughout the afternoon.

Morning Prayer in the Church during the Triduum — I'm not sure of my parish history on this one, as this may have been done in the past, but not recently. On the mornings of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, the Dominican friars invite everyone to join us for the praying of the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours at 8:00 a.m. in the church. Booklets with the psalms and readings will be provided. The friars pray each morning at 8:00 a.m. in the Priory Chapel, but for the Triduum, we will be opening up our common prayer to anyone who wishes to join us, and we will use the church to accommodate visitors. This will also offer a liturgical celebration for anyone who cannot come out at night during the Triduum.

Blessing of Easter Baskets on Holy Saturday – As the first Eastern European pastor of St. Patrick's, I'm not sure how the Irish will respond to this tradition! However, in many Slavic cultures, there is a custom of bringing your Easter baskets to the church on Holy Saturday, filled with bread, cheese, butter, eggs, meat, and anything else for your Easter feast the next day. The priest blesses the baskets, sending the food home ready for preparation on the greatest feast of the year! Growing up in Youngstown, this practice was so widespread that pretty much all parishes held this blessing, regardless if it was a Slavic culture or not (a lot of parishes in Cleveland also carry on this tradition). This year on Holy Saturday, the Blessing of Easter Baskets will take place in the Gallery at 12:30 p.m. on Holy Saturday. If you have an Easter basket that you would like to have blessed, please come down for this special Easter tradition! On Monday, Bishop Fernandes will be here to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. Congratulations to our confirmandi, and a special word of thanks to Sr. Leonarda and our sixth grade catechists for preparing them. Come, Holy

What is the Easter Duty Obligation?

Each of the faithful, after having received their first Holy Communion, is obliged to receive Holy Communion during the Easter Season (Canon 920). This is traditionally linked to the requirement to confess grave sins at least once a year (Canon 989).

What is Fast and Abstinence?

Fasting is the limitation of food, allowing a person to eat one full meal and two smaller meals, with no solid foods eaten between meals. The two smaller meals combined should not exceed the amount eaten at the full meal. All Catholics ages 18-59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Abstinence prohibits the eating of meat (beast or fowl), though eggs, milk, and cheese are permitted. All Catholics 14 years old and older are obliged to abstain on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.





Mark Your Calendars... C.R.A.S.E. CIVILIAN RESPONSE TO ACTIVE SHOOTER EVENTS FOR CITIZENS, BUSINESSES & ORGANIZATIONS Preparing for the Unthinkable!

St. Patrick Church and the Columbus Division of Police will offer an important training session on Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (C.R.A.S.E) Training — Active Shooter Safety Planning on Saturday, April 12, 2025, from 12:00-3:30 p.m. Active shooter training is essential to prepare you for the possibility of a violent attack. This training provides strategies and guidance for surviving an active shooter event, focusing on the "Avoid, Deny and Defend" strategy. It shows you how to recognize the warning signs of potential violence and react if an active shooter or violent individual enters the building. The parish staff and some parishioners have experienced this training and found it most valuable.

Even if you have previously taken this training, I would highly recommend you consider taking it again. There have been some significant updates.

All Ushers, Lectors, Hospitality, CCD Catechists, CCD Aides, Choir and Special Event Coordinators (i.e., Youth Group, American Heritage Girls, etc., and those who help) are highly encouraged to attend.

This training session is open to all interested parishioners over the age of 16 years old. We ask that you make room in your schedule to accommodate this training session. The more aware we are of how to handle these potentially chaotic situations, the more help we can be in a crisis situation. As one of our staff said after attending the training, "I always thought I'd freeze if faced with an active shooter situation. Now I have the knowledge on how to act and help others too." 


