A fountain of Divine Mercy is opened

Dear friends,

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus unleashes a great fountain of grace for the Church: he commissions his apostles and their successors—the bishops, and their helpers, the priests—to forgive sins.

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." As a priest, I have experienced firsthand that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is among the most powerful experiences

of Reconciliation is among the most powerful experiences of the peace and freedom God gives. We remember this powerful fountain of mercy today, on Divine Mercy Sunday.

Pope St. John Paul II designated the second Sunday of Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday in a surprise announcement at the canonization of Sister Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938). The Polish nun, beatified in 1993, and canonized in 2000, on the second Sunday of Easter, began the spiritual movement of Divine Mercy.

Jesus said to St. Faustina Kowalska in 1936:

My daughter, tell the whole world about my inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow[s] are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy thoughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.

The image of Divine Mercy shows the source of mercy: the pierced heart of Jesus. On this Feast, we can open wide our

doors to the fountain of Mercy, and call that mercy upon others who need it, even though their doors may be closed. We open wide the doors to Christ, asking for him to enter through sacraments, especially Eucharist and Reconciliation. There are two rays streaming from the heart of Christ in the Divine Mercy Image: red = life given to souls (especially through the Eucharist); clear = purifying mercy that takes away our sins (especially through the Sacrament of Reconciliation). This is connected to the blood and water that flowed from the pierced side of Christ on the Cross. Our Lord encourages us through St. Faustina Kolwalska to receive the Eucharist on Divine Mercy Sunday and also go to Confession (within 20 days).

Whatever fear or obstacles or suffering you are bearing in your life, may this Divine Mercy Sunday be a great gateway for the Lord's mercy to break through and pour out upon you!

Here are the conditions for receiving a plenary indulgence on this Divine Mercy Sunday:

- In any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!")
- Sacramental Confession (according to previously issued norms, within about 20 days before or after)
- Eucharistic Communion (according to previously issued norms, preferably on the day, or the days before or after)
- Prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, such as by offering an Our Father, a Hail Mary, and a Glory Be

Today is an excellent day to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy—especially interceding for those in our families and among those we know whose doors seem locked to Jesus. We trust that Jesus can open the doors that we cannot. He loves our loved ones (including the doubting Thomases) even more than we do, and will not give up on them.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet can be prayed on the Rosary beads and takes only about 5 minutes to pray. If you don't know how to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, this would be a great time to learn! You can also easily find instructions online. This would also be a great day to practice charity: Christ revealed to St. Faustina that deeds of mercy for our neighbors out of love for Christ are an essential part of Divine Mercy Sunday.

May the Divine Mercy of Jesus Christ be a fountain for you today in your own soul, and in your family!







How to Recite the Chaplet

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited using ordinary Rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska* and followed by a closing prayer.



1. Make the Sign of the Cross

2. Optional Opening Prayers

St. Faustina's Prayer for Sinners: *O Jesus, eternal Truth, our Life, I call upon You and I beg Your mercy for poor sinners. O sweetest Heart of my Lord, full of pity and unfathomable mercy, I plead with You for poor sinners. O Most Sacred Heart, Fount of Mercy from which gush forth rays of inconceivable graces upon the entire human race, I beg of You light for poor sinners. O Jesus, be mindful of Your own bitter Passion and do not permit the loss of souls redeemed at so dear a price of Your most precious Blood. O Jesus, when I consider the great price of Your Blood, I rejoice at its immensity, for one drop alone would have been enough for the salvation of all sinners. Although sin is an abyss of wickedness and ingratitude, the price paid for us can never be equaled. Therefore, let every soul trust in the Passion of the Lord, and place its hope in His mercy. God will not deny His mercy to anyone. Heaven and earth may change, but God's mercy will never be exhausted. <i>Oh, what immense joy burns in my heart when I contemplate Your incomprehensible goodness, O Jesus! I desire to bring all sinners to Your feet that they may glorify Your mercy throughout endless ages* (Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, 72). You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. *O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.* **(Repeat three times)** O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!

4. Hail Mary

5. The Apostles' Creed: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

6. The Eternal Father: Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the remaining decades: Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times): Holy God, Holy Mighty One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
