Dominican Friars



For the past five and a half weeks of Lent, we have been preparing for Easter, culminating with our entrance into Holy Week. We're almost there, but our preparation isn't complete yet. May this week ahead be a time of true spiritual renewal and final preparation for next Sunday's celebration of Easter. If you haven't made it to confession yet during Lent (or need to go back before the Lord rises), please see the number of extra times that the sacrament will be available this week (and times when additional priests will be scheduled).

While Lent is the time of spiritual preparation for Easter, there have been a number of volunteers and ministries in the parish who have helped us prepare in other ways:

- Father Albert and the O.C.I.A. team have been diligent in preparing our elect and those being received into the Church, which will happen during the Easter Vigil. Five people will be baptized and eight people will be received into the Church (all of whom will be confirmed), and another two adults who will complete initiation with Confirmation.
- The Pastoral Council led a pre-Easter church cleaning on April 6th, giving our church an extra shine for Holy Week.
- The Daughters of Veronica, our sacristan ministry for girls and their mothers, helped to clean and polish our brass candle followers and sacred vessels. They also veiled all the statues and religious art in the church and parish center last weekend ahead of Passiontide.
- The American Heritage Girls helped stuff 400 new taper candles for the Easter Vigil and sorted through partially burned ones that we will re-use on Holy Thursday.
- Our Choir has been putting in hours of extra rehearsal time for singing during the liturgies this week.
- Our altar boys will be coming in this week for rehearsals for all the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum.
- The Knights of Columbus, after finishing up six successful fish fries, will help on Holy Thursday and Good Friday as ushers for the many people expected to come for confession.
- Our lectors and ushers are gearing up for extra liturgies during this week.
- And our parish staff and maintenance crew have been taking extra care in so many ways to prepare the parish for Easter.

As Holy Week begins, be open to the graces that await! Whether you can come to some or all the liturgies of the Triduum, to Solemn Vespers earlier in the week, or stopping in for Eucharistic adoration, don't let these final days of preparation go to waste! On a special note, all are invited to the Diocesan Chrism Mass on Tuesday at 3:30 p.m. at St. Paul the Apostle Church in Westerville. This is a great celebration of our diocesan Church, and a beautiful Mass for the consecration of the Sacred Chrism and the blessing of the oils of catechumens and the sick (our own Fr. Paul Keller, the diocesan Director of the Office of Divine Worship, has been busy with his own preparations for this Mass!). Consider attending and experience the sacramental richness of our Church!

## GOOD FRIDAY IS AN OBLIGATORY DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting is the limitation of food, allowing a person to eat one full meal and two smaller meals, with no solid foods eaten between meals. The two smaller meals combined should not exceed the amount eaten at the full meal. All Catholics over the age of 18 and who have not yet completed their 60th year are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Abstinence prohibits the eating of meat (beast or fowl), though eggs, milk, and cheese are permitted. All Catholics 14 years old and older are obliged to abstain on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

#### EASTER DUTY OBLIGATION

Each of the faithful, after having received their first Holy Communion, is obliged to receive Holy Communion during the Easter season [through Pentecost] (Canon 920). This is traditionally linked to the requirement to confess grave sins at least once a year (Canon 989).




