More details about the leadership transition at St. Patrick

Dear friends,

Last weekend, I announced at all of the Masses that I have received a new assignment, and I thought I would give you a few more details about this and about the transition in the pastoral leadership at St. Patrick.

Our Dominican Province of Saint Joseph has accepted a new ministry at a parish in the Diocese of Rockville Centre on Long Island in New York, and my Provincial has asked me to serve as the pastor. The parish that the friars will be serving is Saint Barnabas the Apostle in Bellmore, New York, in southern Nassau County. By the time you read this, I will have already been there to visit the parish for the first time, to meet the current pastor and the parish staff, and to spend some time with Bishop John Barres, who has gladly invited the Dominican friars into the Diocese. I will be moving to St. Barnabas in late June along with three other Dominican priests: Fr. Joseph-Mary Hertzog, O.P., Fr. James Ritch, O.P., and (soon-to-be) Fr. Luke Neitzke, O.P. Fr. James and Fr. Luke will assist me in the pastoral care of the people of St. Barnabas Parish, and Fr. Joseph-Mary will be helping as a preacher throughout the Diocese.

My last weekend here at St. Patrick will be June 8 and 9. Fr. Paul Marich, O.P. will become the pastor of St. Patrick on Monday, June 10. Bishop Fernandes will be here at St. Patrick for Fr. Paul's formal installation as pastor on Saturday, June 29 at our 5:00 p.m. Vigil Mass.

Another Dominican priest, Fr. Edmund Ditton, O.P., will be coming this summer to begin a new assignment to serve at St. Patrick as a parochial vicar along with Fr. Albert Dempsey, O.P., and Fr. Michael Donahue, O.P., so you will be back to four full-time parish priests on the staff here.Fr. Edmund Ditton is an experienced Dominican priest who years ago helped at St. Patrick in the summers when he was teaching at the Angelicum in Rome. He has most recently been serving at St. Rose Parish in Springfield, Kentucky.

Also, later this summer you will have a newly-ordained Dominican priest temporarily helping out at St. Patrick: (soon-to-be) Fr. Cornelius Avaritt, O.P. He will be returning to Washington, D.C. at the end of the summer to continue his studies for the License in Sacred Theology. You will also have two student brothers helping out for the summer at St. Patrick.

As I said last weekend, while I am honored to be helping to begin a new Dominican ministry and community, I will greatly miss St. Patrick. I have been here for over seven years—my longest assignment anywhere since I have been in the Dominican Order—but it still seems too short to be with such wonderful people like you. Thank you for welcoming me into this parish and into your lives, especially as a first-time pastor. Thank you for your patience, your kindness, your generosity in serving, your deep love for Christ, your witness of living our Catholic faith, and for your many prayers.

And I am glad to say that I will be leaving this great parish in great hands. Fr. Paul Marich is truly a natural as a pastor, and he has already begun attending Pastoral Council and Finance Council meetings along with me. It is great to have him on-site, and I have been meeting with him regularly to help ensure a good transition. Please continue to pray for Fr. Paul as he prepares to become your pastor, for me as I prepare to serve the people of St. Barnabas, for Fr. Edmund Ditton as he prepares to serve you as a parochial vicar, and for Fr. Albert and Fr. Michael as they continue their priestly ministry to you at this great parish.



He is the third priestborn in the United States to be raised to this honor, and the first priest to be beatified who spent his whole priestly ministry in a US parish.
