Christ is Risen! Indeed He is Risen! After the penance of Lent and the sorrow of Good Friday, we come to this glorious day – the Resurrection of Christ from the tomb. He has conquered sin and death and has given us new life!

This past Lent may have been a time of fruitful blessings and transformation. Or it may not have been the best of Lents. Some may be glad to get through Easter, and just "move on." But we can't be complacent in our attitude as disciples of Jesus Christ. He is Risen! Now, what comes next is up to the Spirit, and what He wants to do in our lives, just as it was for the apostles. Don't be afraid to follow His promptings, and don't close off the graces that come in this Easter season and beyond. Be open to the power of the Resurrection in your life!

On behalf of all the Dominican Friars of St. Patrick Priory, the Dominican Sisters who serve us so diligently, and our parish staff, I wish all of you and your families a blessed and happy Easter! Alleluia!

LITURGICAL ADJUSTMENTS FOR THE EASTER SEASON

As you walked into church today, you may have noticed something particularly out of the ordinary — a clear sanctuary lamp suspended from the ceiling. This is not an accident, but a Dominican custom in which the glass vessel which holds the sanctuary candle (called the globe) is clear, instead of the red glass which we are used to seeing in many churches. We have obtained a clear glass globe, and in order to incorporate this Dominican custom at certain points throughout the year, we will use the clear globe during the festive seasons of Easter and Christmas (the red globe will return for Pentecost Sunday).

As an extension of our Lenten liturgical practices, at Sunday Masses with music, we will continue to chant the proper Entrance Antiphons in the *Lumen Christi Missal* at the beginning of Mass during the Easter season (with the exception of Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday). We will also continue to chant the Our Father in Latin.

April 22nd – Initiation as an Experience and Its Relevance for Today


THE APPEAL 2024 UPDATE

The Diocese of Columbus has extended the deadline for *The Appeal* 2024 until April 30th. If you haven't given to this campaign yet, please do so over the next ten days, as everything over our goal comes back to the parish free of the diocesan assessment (which currently stands at 9%). All of the surplus will go to benefit our projects for a new parish center roof and updated church lighting.

Our parish goal for 2024, set by the Diocese, was \$153,636.70. As of April 9th, we have received pledges worth \$299,045.95 (of which \$295,985.95 have been paid, leaving unpaid pledges of \$3,060.00). This is a sign of incredible generosity from the parish, and a testament of your great enthusiasm for supporting the needs of the parish. If you haven't paid off your pledge yet, please do so before the end of the month.

As we get closer to the extended deadline, I have a new challenge for our parishioners: help us officially double our 2024 goal! This figure would be \$307,273.40. Based on current pledges, we are only \$8,227.45 shy of this momentous accomplishment (\$11,287.45 if you factor unpaid pledges). Will you help us meet this challenge, which will benefit our parish for years to come? Every little bit helps. Please consider giving to *The Appeal* for 2024 today!






THE BENEDICTINE ALTAR ARRANGEMENT

As you walk into church on Easter Sunday, you'll notice something different about the altar candles – they are now sitting on the altar, three on either side of the altar crucifix. This is called the Benedictine altar arrangement, named in honor of the late Pope Benedict XVI. We have had a modified form of this arrangement until now, with three large candlesticks sitting on the floor next to the altar, but this new arrangement is more in keeping with Pope Benedict's vision. During his ministry as a renowned theologian, bishop, and pope, Benedict XVI encouraged this practice as a more traditional way of adorning free-standing altars. The crucifix sits at the center of the altar (which has already been our practice at St. Patrick's), so that both priest and people are looking ad Dominum ("toward the Lord"). The placement of the candlesticks on the altar does make a barrier of sorts, but this is on purpose: rather than the focus centering on the personality of the individual priest (which is a risk when Mass is celebrated facing the people), the candlesticks help to create a sense of reverence centered on the crucifix, so that both priest and people can be properly focused on the Lord when He comes to us in the Eucharist. The three candles on either side of the crucifix mirrors the arrangement of the altar candlesticks on the high altar. Thus, whether Mass is celebrated on the high altar (ad orientem - "toward the East") or on the altar of sacrifice (versus populum – "against the people"), we are always focused on the Lord, as both altars will be arranged in the same manner. This altar arrangement has been making a revival in many parishes over the last several years, including a number of parishes in the Diocese of Columbus. As for the floor candlesticks that had been in use: they will be used for other purposes, notably to adorn the St. Michael statue by the north exit, as well as for special uses on All Souls Day and during Lent. The Benedictine altar arrangement was introduced at St. Patrick's during the Easter Vigil on April 19, 2025, which coincidentally was the 20th anniversary of Pope Benedict XVI's election to the papacy.
