

What a week! Like many of you, I woke up on Easter Monday to find out that Pope Francis had died during the night. The Holy Father's health had been declining over the last couple of months, but after seeing him greeting the people in St. Peter's Square on Easter Sunday, it didn't seem like he was in his final hours. But now, the See of Peter is vacant, as we mourn the death of the Pope.

With the Pope's funeral on Saturday, we now begin a period of nine days of mourning — what is called the *novemdiales*, or "nine days." This will be a period for special prayers and Masses for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis, before the College of Cardinals begin the papal conclave. When walking into church today, you would have seen black bunting above all the entrances. This is a custom to drape the doors of the church upon the death of a pope, proclaiming to the outside world that the Church is in a state of mourning (and when a new pope is elected, the black bunting will be replaced with white and gold bunting, signifying the Church's joy at the election of a new Pontiff).

As people of faith, we can see the death of a Pope and the election of a new one all in light of Jesus' Resurrection. For three days, Jesus was dead, His lifeless body in the tomb. But He rose victoriously, which we celebrate in these fifty days of Easter! Right now, Christ has no vicar on earth, as He has called Pope Francis from this life. But in a couple weeks, a new Pope will be elected, and there will once again be a Vicar of Christ on earth. It's a good reminder for us that Jesus is in control of the Church; those who serve as Pope do so for only a time, and in the name of Christ, the Head and Cornerstone of the Church.

In these coming days, please pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis. Today is Divine Mercy Sunday, and so we ask the Lord to shower His mercy upon his soul. In a particular way, I want to invite everyone to a special Mass on Monday, April 28th at 11:45 a.m., which will be offered for Pope Francis. In a Mass for a Deceased Pope, the priest wears red, signifying the Pope's office as the Successor of St. Peter the Apostle (rather than the typical black, violet, or white vestments worn at other Masses for the Dead).

I also want to encourage everyone to start praying hard for the upcoming papal conclave. Pray that the Holy Spirit will guide the College of Cardinals to elect a Successor of St. Peter who will govern the Church wisely and prudently, who will enrich the sacramental and liturgical life of the Church, and who will teach the Catholic faith fully and clearly. Jesus told St. Peter: "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." In this time of uncertainty, as we await the election of a new Pope, take comfort in these words of our Lord. I encourage everyone to pray a novena to the Holy Spirit in these days ahead for the upcoming conclave.

Since the Feast of St. Margaret of Castello fell on Palm Sunday this year, Bishop Fernandes has given our parish permission to transfer her feast day to the next open date on the liturgical calendar, which will be Monday, April 28th. We will commemorate her feast day at the 7:00 a.m. Mass that day.

With the death of Pope Francis, each parish is asked to have a special Mass for the repose of his soul, and the Dominican friars also have this obligation when a Pope dies. The 11:45 a.m. Mass on Monday will be offered for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis, using the proper prayers for a Pope from the Masses for the Dead.

#### LITURGICAL CATECHESIS – THE AMBRY AND THE HOLY OILS

Have you ever noticed the gold container across from the baptismal font in the Gallery? It sort of looks like a tabernacle, but it also doesn't seem to be the right place to reserve the Blessed Sacrament. Children often wonder what this is for. This is called the ambry, and it is the place of reservation for the three

holy oils blessed and consecrated by the Bishop during Holy Week (the Oil of the Catechumens and the Oil of the Sick are blessed, and the Sacred Chrism is consecrated). The door of the ambry says *Olea Sancta*, which is Latin for "holy oils." Since these oils are sanctified (particularly the Sacred Chrism), it is important to keep them in a reverent and safe place (though not quite as dignified as the tabernacle, which contains the Blessed Sacrament). In some churches, the ambry has clear glass windows so that the faithful can see the oils. Usually, the ambry is near the baptismal font (as it is at St. Patrick's), since two of the oils are needed for the celebration of Baptism.



#### HOW TO RECITE THE CHAPLET

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is recited using ordinary Rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska* and followed by a closing prayer.



- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross
- 2. Optional Opening Prayers

St. Faustina's Prayer for Sinners: O Jesus, eternal Truth, our Life, I call upon You and I beg Your mercy for poor sinners. O sweetest Heart of my Lord, full of pity and unfathomable mercy, I plead with You for poor sinners. O Most Sacred Heart, Fount of Mercy from which gush forth rays of inconceivable graces upon the entire human race, I beg of You light for poor sinners. O Jesus, be mindful of Your own bitter Passion and do not permit the loss of souls redeemed at so dear a price of Your most precious Blood. O Jesus, when I consider the great price of Your Blood, I rejoice at its immensity, for one drop alone would have been enough for the salvation of all sinners. Although sin is an abyss of wickedness and ingratitude, the price paid for us can never be equaled. Therefore, let every soul trust in the Passion of the Lord, and place its hope in His mercy. God will not deny His mercy to anyone. Heaven and earth may change, but God's mercy will never be exhausted. Oh, what immense joy burns in my heart when I contemplate Your incomprehensible goodness, O Jesus! I desire to bring all sinners to Your feet that they may glorify Your mercy throughout endless ages (Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, 72). You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us. (Repeat three times) O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!

#### 3. Our Father

- 4. Hail Mary
- **5. The Apostles' Creed:** I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
- **6. The Eternal Father:** Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
- 7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
- **8. Repeat for the remaining decades:** Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.
- **9.** Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times): Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

#### DO CATHOLICS "KEEP" CHRIST ON THE CROSS?

Many non-Catholics struggle with the crucifix. An empty cross feels acceptable, even inspiring, but a crucifix depicting the Lord Jesus Christ suffering and dying unsettles them.

"He's not on the cross anymore," some argue. "He is reigning gloriously in Heaven. Why focus on His death?" A fair question, and it deserves a fair answer.

Catholics honor both the Crucifixion and the Resurrection of Jesus because neither stands alone. Our manger scenes, stained glass windows, icons, and statues show the Lord Jesus as a baby, a child, a teacher. Every stage of His life matters, but His death on the cross is the very reason He came. As He said, "For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth" (John 18:37).

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once said on Life Is Worth Living, "Keep your eyes on the crucifix, for Jesus without the cross is a man without a mission, and the cross without Jesus is a burden without a reliever."

An empty cross immediately calls Christ to mind. That's because the cross only matters because Christ died on it for our salvation. Which is why Saint Paul warned against allowing the cross to be "emptied of its power" (1 Corinthians 1:17).

Christ's supreme saving act was His death. By dying on the cross, He conquered death. His Resurrection proved His victory. By gloriously rising from the dead, He confirmed beyond dispute that He was exactly who He said He was: God.

The Crucifixion of Jesus changed history forever. His bodily Resurrection proved it.

By His death on the cross, Christ defeated sin, put death to death, opened Heaven to the faithful, and reconciled us to the Father (2 Corinthians 5:19; Ephesians 2:13–18; Colossians 1:19–20).

This is why **the crucifix is such a powerful reminder of His saving sacrifice.** It's a riveting visual that should stop you in your tracks and lift your heart in gratitude and praise.

Resurrection and eternal glory await those who follow Jesus Christ, but only after they have walked the way of the cross in His footsteps.

Jesus said, "If any man would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me" (Matthew 16:24; 10:38).

Saint Paul understood this. He wrote, "When I came to you, brethren, I did not come proclaiming to you the testimony of God in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified" (1 Corinthians 2:1–2).

He also declared: "For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. . . . For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but **we preach Christ crucified**" (1 Corinthians 1:18–24).

In Galatians 6:14, he exults, "But far be it from me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

The early Christians did not shrink from the grim reality of Christ's death. Saint Paul exhorted them, "For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes" (1 Corinthians 11:26).

On Calvary, some shouted at Jesus, "Come down off your cross!" (see Matthew 27:40; Mark 15:30). Today, sadly, some echo that same misguided cry, objecting to crucifixes as if they somehow dishonored Him. Far from it.

But Catholics know better.

We Catholics strive to echo the wisdom of Saint Paul: "I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified" (1 Corinthians 2:2).

If you want to deepen your love for Jesus, stand or kneel before a crucifix. Prayerfully read the Gospel accounts of His Passion. Let the power of His sacrifice permeate deeply into your soul.

Remember: Christ on the crucifix is not defeat. It shows forth His triumphant victory over evil.


