From the Desk of the Pastor

I'm away from St. Patrick's this weekend, as I've traveled to Texas for a priest conference in Austin, followed by a few days to visit my father in San Antonio. This is the first weekend that I've been away from the parish since becoming pastor, and I miss you already! But I look forward to returning from the conference with a little more insight, and perhaps there will be a new pope by next Sunday.

The priest conference, sponsored by the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology in Steubenville, was led by Catholic Scripture scholars and authors Scott Hahn and John Bergsma, and the theme of the conference was *Jubilee*, focusing on the Scriptural roots of the Jubilee Year. It was a true blessing to gather with 175 priests from 38 states and seven countries for study and workshops, as well as prayer and fraternity. I hope that in the coming weeks and months I'll be able to share the fruits of this conference in my own preaching and teaching of the faith.

Continue to pray for the Papal Conclave, which opens this Wednesday. There are 135 Cardinals who will vote to elect the next Pope (with a 2/3 plus 1 majority vote required to elect). Come, Holy Spirit and guide the College of Cardinals to elect a pope who will be a man of holiness and prayer, who will shepherd the Universal Church in wisdom, and who will teach the faith clearly and fully.

In reflecting upon my address to the parish last weekend about new assignments for both Fr. Albert and Sr. Leonarda, it dawned on me that as a Church, we're experiencing transition on both the local and universal levels. It's not easy to lose friars and sisters we've come to love over their years of service at the parish, and wonder "what will the next person be like?" And yet the whole Church has that feeling right now, wondering "who's it going to be? What will the next pope be like?" And yet we trust – Jesus has led and protected His Church for 2,000 years, and it is still standing. Sisters, priests, pastors, bishops, and even popes come and go, but Christ always remains. The Paschal candle which burns during this Easter season is a reminder that Christ is our strong pillar of salvation, burning brightly with the light of truth, a light which will never be extinguished!

CIVILIAN RESPONSE TO ACTIVE SHOOTER EVENTS FOR CITIZENS, BUSINESSES & ORGANIZATIONS

Preparing for the Unthinkable!

St. Patrick Church and the Columbus Division of Police will offer an important training session on **Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (C.R.A.S.E) Training - Active Shooter Safety Planning** on **Saturday, May 17, 2025, from 12:00-3:30 p.m.** Active shooter training is essential to prepare you for the possibility of a violent attack. This training provides strategies and guidance for surviving an active shooter event, focusing on the “Avoid, Deny and Defend” strategy. It shows you how to recognize the warning signs of potential violence and react if an active shooter or violent individual enters the building. The parish staff and some parishioners have experienced this training and found it most valuable.

Even if you have previously taken this training, there have been some significant updates, making a refresher session recommended.

All Ushers, Lectors, Hospitality, CCD Catechists and CCD Aides, Choir and Special Events Coordinators (i.e., Youth Group, American Heritage Girls, etc., and those who help out) are highly encouraged to attend.

This training session is open to all interested parishioners over the age of 16 years old.

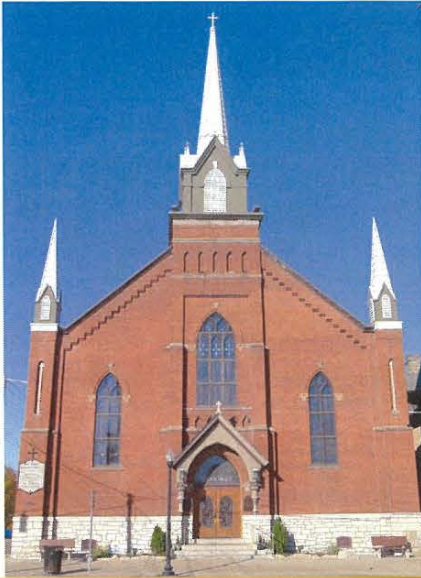
We ask that you make room in your schedule to accommodate this training session. The more aware we are of how to handle these potentially chaotic situations, the more help we can be in a crisis situation. As one of our staff said after attending the training, “I always thought I’d freeze if faced with an active shooter situation, now I have the knowledge on how to act and help others, too.”

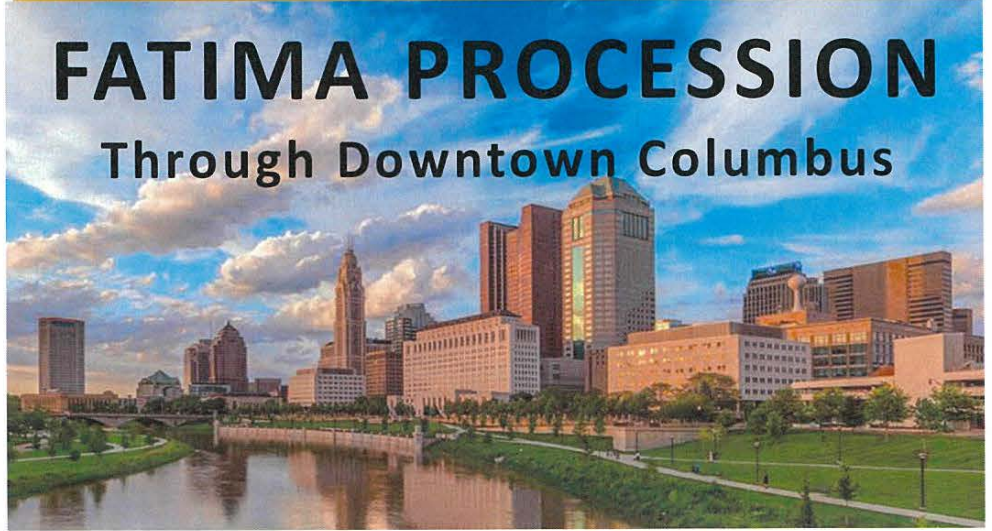

6 PM Begin boarding Shuttle Buses at St. Patrick Church to Holy Family Church for those who park at St. Patrick and wish to be in the procession.

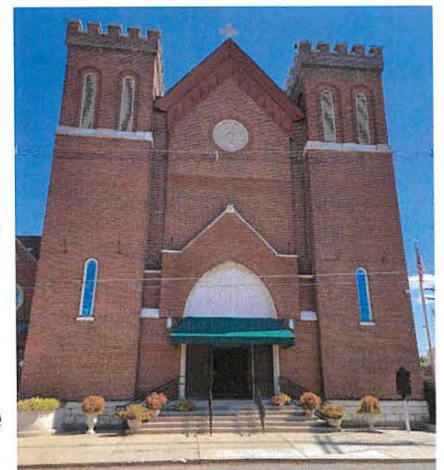
