We give thanks to God for the election of Pope Leo XIV, and we pray for the health and intentions of our new Holy Father. How special this moment is for us as Americans, as we witness the election of the first Pope from the United States – an event that many people said would never happen! May the Lord guide him and direct him constantly, that he may teach the faith clearly, govern wisely, and enrich the Church through the sacraments. It's important to remember the emotional toll that overcomes the man who is elected the Vicar of Christ on earth. Once elected, the new Pope walks into a room off the Sistine Chapel called the "Room of Tears," where his new papal attire awaits him. But as he vests, the thought of his new office, and the weight of shepherding the Universal Church, comes over him – hence the name of the vesting room. When Pope Leo came out onto the loggia of St. Peter's Basilica on Thursday, tears were still visible in his eyes.

There is also the story from the Acts of Peter, a non-Scriptural early Christian writing, that tells the story of St. Peter fleeing his martyrdom by crucifixion in Rome, only to encounter the Risen Jesus on the road. Peter asks Jesus "Where are you going?" – *Quo Vadis?* in Latin. Jesus responds to Peter: "I am going to Rome to be crucified again." Peter, realizing his call to imitate Christ, goes courageously to his crucifixion, conforming his life to Christ fully, even in death. Whether this story actually happened is up to speculation, but it teaches a very important lesson. The man about to be elected the Successor of St. Peter may have thoughts of turning back like Peter; becoming Pope would change his life forever. But then Christ stands before him, inviting him to be His vicar on earth. The new Pope must learn to conform his life to Christ and His Cross in a fuller and deeper way each day. Yet he relies on the prayers of the Catholic faithful, who support him and remember his intentions before the Lord. Pray for Pope Leo, as he assumes the awesome and weighty responsibility of Chief Shepherd of the Universal Church.

CIVILIAN RESPONSE TO ACTIVE SHOOTER EVENTS FOR CITIZENS, BUSINESSES & ORGANIZATIONS

Preparing for the Unthinkable!

St. Patrick Church and the Columbus Division of Police will offer an important training session on **Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (C.R.A.S.E) Training - Active Shooter Safety Planning** on **Saturday, May 17, 2025, from 12:00-3:30 p.m.** Active shooter training is essential to prepare you for the possibility of a violent attack. This training provides strategies and guidance for surviving an active shooter event, focusing on the “Avoid, Deny and Defend” strategy. It shows you how to recognize the warning signs of potential violence and react if an active shooter or violent individual enters the building. The parish staff and some parishioners have experienced this training and found it most valuable.

Even if you have previously taken this training, there have been some significant updates, making a refresher session recommended.

All Ushers, Lectors, Hospitality, CCD Catechists and CCD Aides, Choir and Special Events Coordinators (i.e., Youth Group, American Heritage Girls, etc., and those who help out) are highly encouraged to attend.

This training session is open to all interested parishioners over the age of 16 years old.

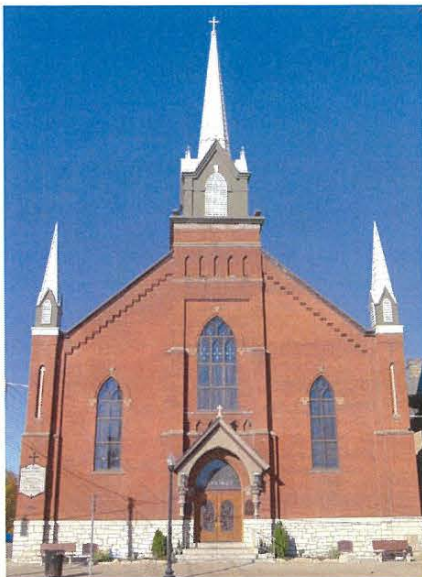
We ask that you make room in your schedule to accommodate this training session. The more aware we are of how to handle these potentially chaotic situations, the more help we can be in a crisis situation. As one of our staff said after attending the training, “I always thought I’d freeze if faced with an active shooter situation, now I have the knowledge on how to act and help others, too.”

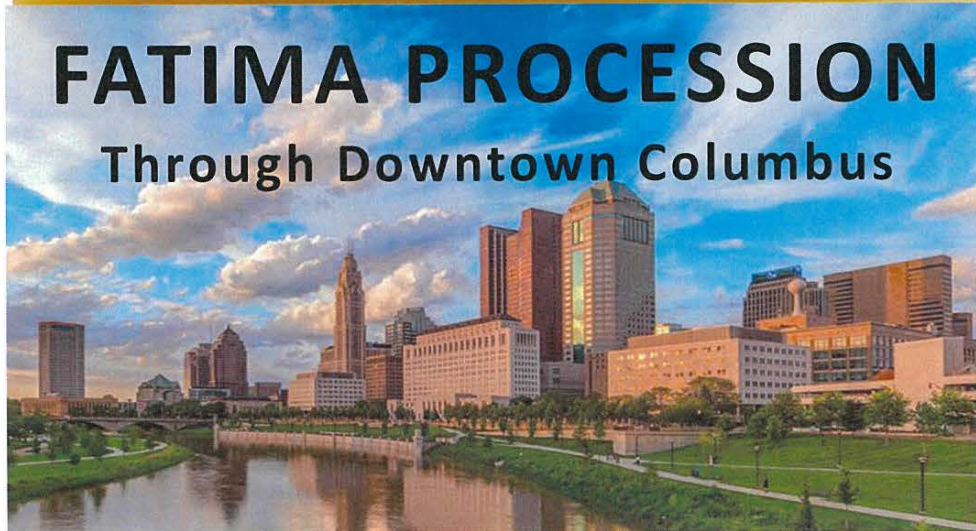
