From the Desk of the Pastor

Today we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – Corpus Christi. It is a day to celebrate the Eucharist in all its glory! This feast is particularly special for Dominicans, since the texts of the Mass and Liturgy of the Hours for this day were composed by St. Thomas Aquinas. The hymns that are so familiar to us at Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction – the *O Salutaris* and *Tantum Ergo*, came from the pen of Aquinas!

But Corpus Christi shouldn't be about one day. The Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1324). It is Jesus Himself, body, blood, soul, and divinity, given to us under the appearance of bread and wine. He is with us in our church always, waiting for us to come to Him – to pray, to worship, and to adore. That is why on this feast of Corpus Christi, I want to make an appeal to all parishioners - we'll call it the Adoration Invitation! Are you up for the challenge? Here at St. Patrick's, we've had a holy hour of Eucharistic adoration for many years on Fridays after the 11:45 a.m. Mass, which is usually well attended. We've also had our all-night Eucharistic adoration vigils on third Fridays (praying for life) and on fourth Fridays (praying for vocations). At Advent, we also started all-day Eucharistic adoration on Tuesdays from 12:15-8:00 p.m., which was started in part to give families, working people, and those who don't go out at night a better chance to come and adore our Eucharistic Lord. This has been successful, but we still need more committed adorers on Tuesdays. The all-night vigils could also use some help, as there is often one or two adorers during those very early morning hours. So, are you up for the Adoration Invitation? Can you commit yourself to come and pray for one hour a week? If not for an hour, what about a half hour? Or if you want to pray in a special way for life or vocations, can you make the sacrifice to break your sleep and come during the night, just once a month? The Lord Jesus is waiting for you! Will you accept His invitation to come and adore Him? On Friday, we will be blessing our new image of the Sacred Heart, on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This will take place before the 11:45 a.m. Mass. I encourage you to

come, and then stay for Mass (and adoration!) as we look ahead to another great feast in honor of our Lord this week!

This week is also one of the most exciting weeks at St. Patrick – Vacation Bible School! Sister Leonarda and her team of dedicated volunteers have been working hard preparing for this week, as we welcome so many of our children this week, who will come for fun times with their friends, but more importantly, to learn more about Jesus. VBS at St. Patrick is always special for me, since I came here as a student brother in 2011 to help with this event. It's so great to see this tradition continue, and for more generations of our children to experience VBS. Please pray for our children and volunteers, that they may be filled with many graces in this week ahead.



Greetings from St. Vincent Archabbey,

I send this letter with love and gratitude to all my friends and acquaintances at St. Patrick Church. I just wanted to share an update on what's new in my life. Four years ago, I entered Saint Vincent Benedictine monastery as a Novice and since then I have been living the life of a monk, alongside the other 150 men in our community. It's been a challenging, transformative experience which has brought a new sense of purpose and meaning to my life.

A few weeks ago, the community voted to accept me into solemn vows, and I have discerned that I am ready to make this lifelong commitment. I am forgoing wealth, marriage, and my own independence, for the kingdom of heaven, with full trust in Christ's promise: "Everyone who has given up houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands for the sake of my name, will receive a hundred times more, and will inherit eternal life" Matt 19:29. Over the past 4 years, the great joy and peace I have experienced has confirmed the truth of these words.

Along with three other monks, I will be professing my solemn vows at a special Mass at 4pm on July 11, here at St. Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, Pennsylvania. If you are interested in joining me for this occasion, I would be honored, but more importantly, I ask for your prayers for me and my family.

In addition to my Benedictine monastic vocation, I am also pursuing priestly ordination. I have completed 2 years of philosophy studies and 1 year of theology at St. Vincent Seminary. God willing, I hope to complete my studies and be ordained in May 2028.

I am currently on a mission trip in Jundiaí, Brazil with a group of monks and young adults from St. Vincent College, serving the poorest of the poor on the streets, in favelas (Brazilian shantytowns), homeless shelters and inner-city youth centers. I have been truly moved by the tremendous Catholic faith of the Brazilians. Just one example was when a man called out to us while driving through the city. We stopped and he came up to the car window in tears. He didn't ask for money or food, but a rosary! I gave him mine and he went away with great joy. Providentially, as I was writing this letter in the convent chapel, a Brazilian man tapped me on the shoulder and gave me a new rosary as a gift. Amazing! Within 2 days God arranged to replenish my need!

Saint Vincent began its Brazilian missionary activities in 1964 when it took responsibility for a struggling monastery. Missionary work has been a central apostolate of the Benedictine order since its beginnings nearly 1,500 years ago. In 1846 a Benedictine missionary, Boniface Wimmer, came to the U.S. from Germany, founding St. Vincent Archabbey, which is one of only 11 archabbeys in the world. Since then, missionaries from St. Vincent and its daughter houses have established close to 20 Benedictine monasteries across the U.S. Today, our primary apostolate is St. Vincent College, a Catholic liberal arts college with all the traditional disciplines including engineering, business, and nursing. Over 30 Benedictine monks work in our college, which is more than at any other college in the U.S. For more information about St. Vincent Archabbey, see saintvincentarchabbey.org. P.S. Fun fact – St. Thomas Aquinas received 11 years of spiritual formation and education from the Benedictine monks of Monte Cassino.





Fifth Sunday Collections: Four times a year, during the months which include a fifth Sunday, the 2nd Collection at all Masses benefits Little Margaret's Charity.

Poor Box: Funds dropped in the poor boxes in the church also support the various causes of Little Margaret's Charity.

Donations to Little Margaret's Charity through the 5th Sunday Collection and the Poor Box support parishioners in need, as well as a number of pro-life organizations, including Ohio Right to Life, Greater Columbus Right to Life, Women's Care Center, PDHC, and Bethesda Healing Ministry. The poor and homeless of downtown are also aided by contributions to the Holy Family Soup Kitchen, Faith Mission, J.O.I.N., and the Community Kitchen.

Little Margaret's Charity also sponsors the annual **Giving Tree** at Christmas. The 2024 Giving Tree campaign enabled us to help 9 families, a total of 40 individuals, enjoy a little brighter Christmas. Parishioners donated nearly \$3,000 in gift cards, and about \$3,000 in cash, to assist these parish families.
