Our string of Sunday solemnities for the month of June continues with one more — today's Solemnity of SS. Peter and Paul! This feast is always celebrated on June 29th, but because it is a solemnity (the highest rank of feast on the liturgical calendar), it takes the place of the regular Sunday in Ordinary Time, so it's an opportunity that comes around every few years, and allows our parish to celebrate it on a wider scale.

Obviously, this day is very important for me, as it's my patronal feast day. However, my father is Peter, and my grandfather was Peter, so it has always been an important patronal feast for many of the men in my family. But it has been an important feast in my family for a couple more reasons: my father grew up at SS. Peter and Paul Parish in suburban Cleveland, and my mother grew up at SS. Peter and Paul Parish in Youngstown (the church where my parents were married). That's no coincidence, but the work of Divine Providence! And to top things off, it was one year ago today, on the evening of this solemnity, that Bishop Fernandes came to our church and formally installed me as the pastor of St. Patrick's! Obviously, the apostles of Rome have played (and continue to play) an important part in my life, and this feast in their honor is a day of great rejoicing!

We celebrate this feast with greater solemnity than the feasts of the other apostles not only because SS. Peter and Paul played an important role in the life of the early Church, but also because they are the patrons of the city of Rome. We belong to the Roman Church, and what is celebrated in the city of Rome extends to the whole Church. This day is a holiday in Rome, and the Holy Father celebrates a special Mass on this feast in which he gives the pallium to the new metropolitan archbishops (for those who are wondering: the pallium is a thin vestment worn over the chasuble as a sign of the metropolitan archbishop's jurisdiction and authority, and a metropolitan archbishop is an archbishop who has certain oversight of other dioceses within his province). The Diocese of Columbus falls under the Province of Ohio, led by the Archbishop of Cincinnati, and the new metropolitan Archbishop of Cincinnati, Archbishop Robert Casey, will be receiving his pallium from Pope Leo XIV today.

However, I think there is even greater significance for today's feast this year since we've had the election of a new Pope since last year's celebration. It's a reminder for us that St. Peter continues to hold the keys entrusted to him by Christ, even if there is a short interlude when a pope dies and a new one is elected. A year ago, Francis was pope; today, Leo is pope. Nonetheless, the words are the same for each: *Tu es Petrus* – "you are Peter," and as Jesus tells Peter in today's Gospel "and upon this Rock I will build my Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." In the past two months, we've seen Christ's promise fulfilled once again in the election of a new Successor of St. Peter. As we consider the witness of St. Paul, the apostle to the Gentiles, we have many things to ponder as well. For one, where does Scripture fall in our spiritual life? This is a saint who wrote almost half of the New Testament. If our Bibles have gotten a bit dusty, or if we need to incorporate more Scripture reading into our prayer time, perhaps today would be a good day to renew our devotion to the Word of God. However, St. Paul also traveled near and far to spread the message of Jesus Christ. What are the ways that Christ now calls us to evangelize? If we fear that we are unworthy, or have some great sin in our past, we have no excuse – how can we forget that St. Paul was a great convert?! Today's feast is also a reminder that the Gospel of Jesus Christ won't stop spreading!



Fifth Sunday Collections: Four times a year, during the months which include a fifth Sunday, the 2nd Collection at all Masses benefits Little Margaret's Charity.

Poor Box: Funds dropped in the poor boxes in the church also support the various causes of Little Margaret's Charity.

Donations to Little Margaret's Charity through the 5th Sunday Collection and the Poor Box support parishioners in need, as well as a number of pro-life organizations, including Ohio Right to Life, Greater Columbus Right to Life, Women's Care Center, PDHC, and Bethesda Healing Ministry. The poor and homeless of downtown are also aided by contributions to the Holy Family Soup Kitchen, Faith Mission, J.O.I.N., and the Community Kitchen.

Little Margaret's Charity also sponsors the annual **Giving Tree** at Christmas. The 2024 Giving Tree campaign enabled us to help 9 families, a total of 40 individuals, enjoy a little brighter Christmas. Parishioners donated nearly \$3,000 in gift cards, and about \$3,000 in cash, to assist these parish families.


