Late last week, Bishop Fernandes made an important announcement for the Diocese of Columbus, one that will affect many families in our own parish: the lowering of the age of confirmation to the age of nine or ten, or fourth grade, depending on where the child falls into those ages or grades. The Diocese will begin implementing this in the fall of 2025 in Deanery 6, the Center-South Deanery, which is our Deanery! This is truly exciting, but will also entail a couple of years of logistics and planning in our C.C.D. program.

At St. Patrick's, I don't see this change being as heavy a logistical challenge for us as it will be in other parishes, primarily because we've already been having the celebration of confirmation in the sixth grade (around ages 11-12). For our part, we will have to spend the next year preparing our rising fourth, fifth, and sixth graders for confirmation; contrast this with other parishes that currently have confirmation in the eighth grade, who will have to prepare five grade levels for the sacrament. This process will take these parishes a couple of years to implement. While there will be challenges over the next year, we certainly will have it easier than other parishes. However, our Confirmation Mass next spring will include three grade levels of our C.C.D. students – what a great sight that will be!

Bishop Fernandes has some very good reasons for making this change, and as a priest and pastor, I couldn't agree with him more. One of the Bishop's concerns has been young people leaving the Church at a younger and younger age. For parishes that have confirmation during junior high, some young people may have already dabbled in certain sinful activities, or have begun to question or even reject their faith. Confirmation gives a strengthening of the baptismal grace which will help the young person face the challenges that arise in life, and as we see, at a younger and younger age.

When I think back to formation for the sacrament of confirmation during my own years of Catholic school, I'm even more thrilled about this decision! How many of you like me heard things about completing service hours for confirmation, as if the sacrament was something to be earned, or that confirmation made you an adult in the Church (which meant "you don't have to go to C.C.D. anymore!")? When I was in Catholic grade school up in Youngstown, the age of confirmation was 11th grade! It was a big shock when the Bishop lowered it to 8th grade. But the point remains — the sacrament of confirmation isn't a rite of passage or something that makes one an "adult" in the Church. It is a deepening and strengthening of the grace we received at

baptism. In the Eastern Catholic Churches, it is received as an infant immediately after baptism. As our world becomes more secular and hostile to the faith, our children in those tender ages of nine and ten will need that grace even more!

Lest there be any worries that young people stop going to religious education classes after they are confirmed in the fourth grade, the Bishop makes another point about the change — confirmation should not be seen as a graduation from studying our faith! He's really making a move to change the culture in many parishes with this decision. After confirmation, we all need continued formation in our faith, not just as teens, but even into adulthood (which is why we offer many adult catechesis presentations here on Tuesday evenings). Learning about our faith in Christ never stops, even for our Dominican friars and sisters. May the Bishop's decision truly bear fruit for families in our parish and throughout the Diocese.

There will certainly be more questions ahead, and a need to adjust our plans and curriculum for C.C.D., so please be patient. Pray for us friars, for Sr. Leonarda and for Sr. Marta as they make the transition for the Director of Religious Education position, and for our dedicated catechists. This change will also certainly require a need for more catechists, so if this is something the Lord is putting on your heart, I invite you to consider helping out. God bless you,

SUNDAY AND HOLY DAY MASSES *PRO POPULO* ("FOR THE PEOPLE")

Depending on which Mass you attend, you've likely heard every once in a while that a Mass is offered for "the parishioners and benefactors of St. Patrick Parish." If you look in the bulletin, you'll notice that one of our weekend Masses is always offered for this intention. This is because the *Code of Canon Law* requires pastors to offer a Mass each Sunday and holy day of obligation pro populo, a Latin phrase meaning "for the people" of the parish (Code of Canon Law 534, section 1). Going forward, we will be listing this weekly intention in the bulletin as it is written in canon law: "Pro Populo." Obviously, this includes the parishioners and benefactors of our parish community, so no one is meant to be excluded in the actual intention of the Mass. However, using this Latin phrase allows us to stay more in line with what the Church asks of pastors. During the Universal Prayer at Sunday Mass, the lector will announce this intention in English, saying "for the people of St. Patrick Parish, for whom this Mass is offered." Finally, the friars and office staff are coordinating schedules so that beginning in 2026, the weekly Mass pro populo will usually be celebrated by Fr. Paul, since it is his obligation as the pastor to offer this intention on Sundays and holy days of obligation (a pastor may delegate this responsibility to another priest, but ideally, that would be a rare occurrence). The pro populo intention will continue to rotate among the Sunday Masses, as is the current practice.
