The recent election of Pope Leo XIV — and the choosing of the papal name "Leo" — brought up a lot of speculation about the direction he wanted to take for his papacy. Commentators pointed out how this name choice hearkens back to the last Leo, Pope Leo XIII, who reigned as pope from 1878-1903. No doubt, the Holy Father said in a speech shortly after his election how the example of the last Pope Leo influenced his decision. However, some of the commentators and journalists read a lot into the choice of name, suggesting that the new Pope Leo would be committed to social issues just like the last Pope Leo. This is not necessarily a bad thing — as long as we look at what the last Pope Leo XIII actually taught — instead of reading our present day viewpoints into the current Pope Leo's decision.

On this Labor Day weekend, we remember Pope Leo XIII's commitment to workers, notably in his landmark encyclical letter Rerum Novarum (1891). This set the course for Catholic social teaching, and several popes would mark milestone anniversaries of this encyclical with follow-up encyclicals on Catholic social teaching (the last being St. John Paul II's letter Centesimus Annus, written for the 100th Anniversary of Rerum Novarum in 1991). In Rerum Novarum, Pope Leo XIII emphasized the rights and dignity of workers, coming at the height of the Industrial Revolution, when laborers were often being exploited by unjust working conditions. Things that we take for granted today, like a fair wage for a full day's work, and safe working conditions, were emphasized in the document, which were not secure or guaranteed in the late 19th century. The family was also being disrupted, as fathers were often being taken away from their farms and homesteads to work in factories, often facing many on-the-job risks (without security for their wives and children if injury or death occurred).

At the same time, Pope Leo XIII emphasized the natural right to private ownership of property, and offered a stinging criticism of socialism, which was rapidly rising in his day. Of particular note, Leo XIII gives a warning about how "the socialists, therefore, in setting aside the parent and setting up a State supervision, act against natural justice, and destroy the structure of the home" (*Rerum Novarum* 14). Today, this warning is still relevant, not only in the home and the workplace, but also in schools, in the media, and in the marketplace.

As we celebrate Labor Day, we remember the hard work and dedication that many of our parishioners have undertaken, from those who built our parish over 170 years ago, to those who labor today to support their families. This day is an opportunity for us to remember the dignity which God gives to human labor, as He calls us to work with our hands, and to praise and glorify Him through that work. For those who come to our parish Masses on Labor Day (at 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.), we will be using the prayers from the Mass for the Sanctification of Human Labor. This will allow us to thank God for the blessings He has bestowed upon the work that we have done, that we currently do, and that we will continue to do.

On a final note – what did Pope Leo XIV actually say about his name choice in that address shortly after his election? He noted the challenges Leo XIII faced during the last Industrial Revolution, while also pointing out that we find ourselves in "another industrial revolution... in the field of artificial intelligence that pose new challenges for the defense of human dignity, justice, and labor." This remark caught the commentators by surprise. For now, a further discussion about the matter of artificial intelligence will have to wait, but at least we have some more insight into the mind of our Holy Father.



# REMINDER ON PARKING IN COLUMBUS STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE LOTS

As you know, St. Patrick Church owns the parking lot immediately behind — to the east of — the Priory. The parking lots adjacent to ours and across Grant Avenue belong to **Columbus State Community College.** During most of the week, those wishing to park in Columbus State lots must pay using a smartphone app, QR code, or text message, or risk a \$75.00 fine.

Two years ago, we entered into an arrangement with CSCC wherein we pay rent for use of their two lots for Sunday and Holy Day Masses, and occasional events. We indicate those times with signs which say, "Church Parking Only." When you see those signs, and ONLY when you see those signs, you may park at no charge in those Columbus State parking lots.

The CSCC parking lot management company has recently been ticketing parishioners attending weekday Mass. Please pay attention, and if you park in CSCC lots other than the times displaying "Church Parking Only" signs, be prepared to pay.

Inspired by Saint Margaret of Castello, O.P. the ministry known as **Little Margaret's Charity** has served as St. Patrick's charitable arm for over fifteen years.


