The publishing deadline for last weekend's bulletin came before the horrific events at Annunciation Catholic Church in Minneapolis on August 27th, so I wasn't able to address it last Sunday. Our hearts go out to the parish community there, and for the families who lost their innocent children. We pray that those killed may rest in peace, and that the injured may recover quickly.

In the wake of the tragedy, we have found some commentators denouncing "prayers" as a solution to violence in our society. If anything, our prayers must ramp up at times like this! Prayer is the lifting up of our minds and hearts to God – we do it when we are in need, when we are in trouble, when we are sorry for sin, and as a way to offer God thanks, praise, and adoration. Prayer is the means through which we forge our relationship with God. In the wake of tragedy, loss of life, and fear, our prayers become a way to pray for the dead, to pray for the injured, to pray for those who are scared, and to pray for the change of hearts and minds in society. If we try to focus on our human efforts or abilities whenever we do anything, but don't start with prayer, we will be bound to fail. But in God's Providence, we believe that He moves hearts, and that He brings good out of evil. So often, we want to know what that good solution is right away, but the answer may not be for us to know in this lifetime. That is another reason why we pray – to help us trust in God, and for our hearts to find peace about the goodness of His plan for us.

As more information about the tragedy develops, we've been finding that the perpetrator had severe anti-Catholic motives. Some have asked serious questions about whether demonic possession was involved. Time will tell the answers to these questions, but in the meantime, we must remember to be on guard — not just physically, but spiritually — for there are enemies of the Church who seek to go after Christ's faithful. Let us not fear, but clothe ourselves in Jesus Christ, with the assistance of Our Lady, St. Michael, and all the angels and saints to watch over and protect us.

In light of this tragedy, I would like to extend a word of gratitude to our own parish security team: Bobby Russell, Jason Bowen, and David Hall. They ensure that our people and our facilities are kept safe, and they put additional time into their work (which we don't always see when we see them at their post). After the tragedy in Minnesota, Bobby and I met to discuss any needed updates to our security protocols, which will ensure that what happened in Minnesota never happens here. He has also been diligent in organizing security training courses several times a year, so that our parishioners are always alert and ready in the event of an unforeseen incident. Please pray for the safety of our security team, since they put their lives on the line to keep us safe. If you get a chance, be sure to thank Bobby, Jason, and David the next time you see them!

As the month of September begins, we give thanks to God for the start of several parish ministries over the past week, notably high school and junior high youth ministry and O.C.I.A. Our C.C.D. classes start this weekend, and later this week will see the return of our parish choir. If you've been on vacation this summer or haven't ventured downtown that much: welcome back — it's good to see you! This weekend, we will mark Donut Sunday after all Sunday Masses, sponsored this month by our St. Patrick's Fellowship. On other Sundays, coffee and donuts are available in Patrick Hall between 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. While fellowship on these other Sundays is scheduled during C.C.D. classes, I want to emphasize that everyone is welcome to stop in the hall for coffee, donuts, and fellowship — it is not limited to the parents of C.C.D. students. We also need a number of volunteers to help with coffee and donuts on a regular basis. Can you lend a hand at this ministry?

This month is exciting for me on a personal note, as I will be leaving with Patrick and Nancy Madrid (as well as a number of other parishioners) for our pilgrimage to Rome, Lourdes, and Fatima on September 19th. Starting this weekend, I will keep a notebook at the Welcome Center in the Gallery for you to enter your prayer intentions, which I'll bring to Europe at many different holy sites in the Eternal City and the great shrines of Our Lady.





OCIA is a journey in faith to grasp the richness of the Catholic Church and to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. PROCEDURE FOR RECEIVING LOW-GLUTEN HOSTS AND THE SMALL CHALICE

A number of parishioners and visitors have need of receiving Holy Communion under the species of a low-gluten host, or from a small chalice of the Precious Blood. The friars are happy to help, but we also ask that those in need follow these updated protocols, since we have had to expand the use of the small chalice at most Sunday Masses:

- If you need to use the small chalice, please check in at the sacristy before Mass, and let the priest or one of the altar boys know that you need the chalice.
- If receiving a low-gluten host, please wait until everyone has received Holy Communion, and then kneel on St. Joseph's side to receive Holy Communion. If there are several people receiving a low-gluten host, please line up from the wall of the church and fill in toward the altar rail gate in order to accommodate the most amount of people at the altar rail (however, if there are only one or two people, you don't have to worry about going all the way down toward the wall). This will apply on both Sundays and weekdays.
- If receiving from the small chalice, please wait until everyone has received Holy Communion, and then kneel on Our Lady's side to receive Holy Communion. As there are usually one or two people receiving from the chalice at a specific Mass, there is no need to kneel closer to the wall; you can find a convenient spot on the altar rail. However, kneeling on Our Lady's side will allow the priest to bring the small chalice a shorter distance from the altar of sacrifice. This will apply on both Sundays and weekdays.

This new procedure will allow one priest to distribute low-gluten hosts and another to distribute the small chalice at the same time. Thank you for your cooperation, and hopefully this new procedure will help the distribution of Holy Communion run smoothly.

REMINDER ON PARKING IN COLUMBUS STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE LOTS

As you know, St. Patrick Church owns the parking lot immediately behind — to the east of — the Priory. The parking lots adjacent to ours and across Grant Avenue belong to **Columbus State Community College**. During most of the week, those wishing to park in Columbus State lots must pay using a smartphone app, QR code, or text message, **or risk a \$75.00 fine**.

Two years ago, we entered into an arrangement with CSCC wherein we pay rent for use of their two lots for Sunday and Holy Day Masses, and occasional events. We indicate those times with signs which say, "Church Parking Only." When you see those signs,

and ONLY when you see those signs, you may park at no charge in those Columbus State parking lots. The CSCC parking lot management company has recently been ticketing parishioners attending weekday Mass. Please pay attention, and if you park in CSCC lots other than the times displaying "Church Parking Only" signs,


