This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross — which always falls on September 14th, but as a feast of Our Lord in Ordinary Time, it takes precedence over the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time. I always like to think of this day as the festal celebration of Good Friday: like on Good Friday, our focus is on the Cross, and the priest wears red vestments. However, unlike the somber atmosphere of Good Friday (when no Mass is celebrated and the Church fasts), today is a day of rejoicing and celebration, for by the Cross of Christ, we are saved (and the Mass is celebrated, because now we see the mystery of the Cross in its fullness: the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ for our salvation). As a way to commemorate this feast, our parish's relic of the True Cross will be placed near the ambo for the faithful to venerate between Masses.

Last Sunday was a special day for the Church, as Pope Leo XIV canonized two new saints: St. Pier Giorgio Frassati and St. Carlo Acutis. Of course, St. Pier Giorgio (who lived from 1901-1925) is very important for our parish, as he was a lay Dominican, and our young adult ministry, the Columbus Frassati Society, celebrates him as their patron. But veneration to St. Carlo Acutis (who lived from 1991-2006) has become increasingly popular, since he is considered the first "Millennial Saint." He was known as a computer whiz during his short lifetime, using those skills to promote Eucharistic adoration and the history of Eucharistic miracles. We thank God for these newly canonized saints, and we ask their intercession for our needs here on earth (especially for the young).

For me, this week has been long-awaited: on Friday, I will be flying to Rome for a Jubilee Pilgrimage with parishioners Patrick and Nancy Madrid. While pilgrims will be coming from all over the country, we have a fair share of St. Patrick's parishioners who will be coming. The pilgrimage will start with five days in Rome, including the Wednesday General Audience with Pope Leo on September 24th. From Rome, we travel onto Lourdes for a day, before ending in Fatima. Certainly, the Roman aspect of this pilgrimage is incredibly exciting, particularly in a Jubilee Year and only months after the election of a new pope. This will mark my fourth trip to the Eternal City! However, I have never been to Lourdes or Fatima, so making visits to these great Marian shrines will be truly special. I will be bringing all of you in prayer on my pilgrimage — and don't forget to write your prayer intentions in the little book at the Welcome Center in the Gallery.





PROCEDURE FOR RECEIVING LOW-GLUTEN HOSTS AND THE SMALL CHALICE

A number of parishioners and visitors have need of receiving Holy Communion under the species of a low-gluten host, or from a small chalice of the Precious Blood. The friars are happy to help, but we also ask that those in need follow these updated protocols, since we have had to expand the use of the small chalice at most Sunday Masses:

- —If you need to use the small chalice, please check in at the sacristy before Mass, and let the priest or one of the altar boys know that you need the chalice.
- If receiving a low-gluten host, please wait until everyone has received Holy Communion, and then kneel on St. Joseph's side to receive Holy Communion. If there are several people receiving a low-gluten host, please line up from the wall of the church and fill in toward the altar rail gate in order to accommodate the most amount of people at the altar rail (however, if there are only one or two people, you don't have to worry about going all the way down toward the wall). This will apply on both Sundays and weekdays.
- If receiving from the small chalice, please wait until everyone has received Holy Communion, and then kneel on Our Lady's side to receive Holy Communion. As there are usually one or two people receiving from the chalice at a specific Mass, there is no need to kneel closer to the wall; you can find a convenient spot on the altar rail. However, kneeling on Our Lady's side will allow the priest to bring the small chalice a shorter distance from the altar of sacrifice. This will apply on both Sundays and weekdays.

This new procedure will allow one priest to distribute low-gluten hosts and another to distribute the small chalice at the same time. Thank you for your cooperation, and hopefully this new procedure will help the distribution of Holy Communion run smoothly.


