Buon giorno da Roma! I left for Rome on Friday afternoon and arrived on Saturday morning, preparing for the arrival of the pilgrims on Sunday afternoon. Before the pilgrims arrive, I plan on making a few important Dominican stops during this short amount of free time that I'll have. This will include the celebration of Mass in the room of St. Dominic on Saturday afternoon at the Priory of Santa Sabina (which has been the headquarters of the Dominican Order dating back to the 13th century); then a Saturday evening visit with Archbishop Augustine DiNoia, O.P., who ordained me a priest in 2022 (and who served for many years in the Dominican Province of St. Joseph); and finally a Sunday morning visit to the Angelicum, the Dominican university in Rome, where our own Fr. Raymund Snyder is now teaching, and where Fr. Charles Shonk is completing his doctoral dissertation. Hopefully, I'll have a little reunion with some of our former parochial vicars.

Once the pilgrims arrive, we will start visiting many of the holy sites of Rome, including the four major basilicas, and also touring some of the relics of ancient Rome. This Wednesday, we will be honored to attend the General Audience with His Holiness Pope Leo XIV. Then on Thursday, we will make our way to Lourdes, and on Friday morning, I'll be celebrating Mass at the Basilica. Later that day, we'll make our way to Fatima, where we'll conclude the pilgrimage and return next Monday. Thank you to everyone who entered your prayer intentions in the book that I left in the Gallery; I will be bringing you along on this pilgrimage in prayer! This week will also mark a special time for the priests of the Diocese of Columbus, as they will be gathering for the priests' convocation. Father Michael and Fr. Cornelius will be going to represent St. Patrick's, and Fr. Paul Keller will be there ahead of time and working the convocation, overseeing all the liturgical celebrations for Bishop Fernandes. Please keep the priests of the Diocese in prayer this week. We will still continue to have our regular Mass, confession, and adoration schedule, as Fr. Edmund will be staying behind, and Fr. Hayes, Fr. Blau, and Fr. Juan Macias will be covering in the parish.

Over the last month, a couple maintenance repairs have led to some welcome discoveries, and we may end up not replacing what we took out. First, the green awning that had been positioned over the front doors of the church was in need of replacement, as the cloth was tearing in a few places. However, when the awning was removed, it made the full architecture and design of the front of the church visible once again, which includes the windows above the doors, and capitals on the columns on either side of the doors. Not only that, but the removal of the awning is allowing a flood of natural light to bathe the narthex, which passes into the church through the glass doors. One Tuesday afternoon during adoration, this natural light was shining all the way up to the sanctuary! I've decided that we will not replace the awning, but allow this element of the church's architecture to be shown in all its glory. While the awning served some practical purposes when the front doors were used as a regular entrance, it only covered a few feet, so it hasn't been serving the purpose of covering people during inclement weather (in the event of rain or snow, one can always find cover in the Gallery and its attached vestibule).

A second change has been the removal of the area rug in the sanctuary, which was installed during the church renovations in 2003. The rug was badly worn from years of foot traffic, wax stains, and burn marks from incense charcoals. A number of parishioners have been approaching me over the last couple of years about replacing this rug, and it was clear that the time had come for its removal. However, I'm not sure yet if we'll replace it. An area rug in a church sanctuary is simply a design accent and is not required. Without a rug in the sanctuary, we are able to see the wooden floor in all its splendor. No rug may also help amplify the sound of the priests and lectors, as a rug can absorb the sound of their voices. We'll see — I haven't made a final decision yet on whether we should replace the rug, and would like to test out this new look for a few months.

Speaking of the church building and its architecture — this Thursday marks the 172nd anniversary of the dedication of St. Patrick Church. If you come to Mass here that day, it will be celebrated as a solemnity in the parish (and you can obtain a plenary indulgence for visiting the church, under the usual conditions, and reciting an Our Father and the Creed).





The following article was written by Fr. Paul J. Keller, O.P., and was originally published in The Catholic Times on September 4, 2025. #### Dear Father,

We don't have a Saturday vigil Mass in my church. I thought every church had to have one. I don't know if the bishop knows about this situation and I don't want to get my priest in trouble. I wanted your opinion about if I should talk to my priest about this. Thanks.

#### Dear Sam,

The short answer is no, you don't necessarily need to talk with your priest about this particular situation. And, no, typically the Saturday evening Mass is not a vigil Mass. And, no, not every parish needs one. And, no, you don't need to go to the bishop, and, no, you wouldn't get him in trouble even if you did contact the bishop.

A Saturday evening Mass is not really a "vigil" Mass unless it happens to be the Saturday night before Easter Sunday or the night before special solemnities in the Church. The word vigil comes from the Latin *vigilia*, meaning a watchfulness, staying awake, being alert. At a vigil Mass, we are watching for the actual day of the feast to arrive. Vigil Masses mark very important times for us to be alert to God's power in our lives.

The typical Saturday evening Mass is properly referred to as a Mass of Anticipation or an Anticipated Sunday Mass. When Saturday evening Masses became common, they received the wrong name: Vigil. And, unfortunately, the name has stuck.

Interestingly, the origin of Saturday evening Masses is tied to the beginning of changes to the Eucharistic fasting laws, according to author Shawn Tunink. Prior to 1957, Catholics were required to fast beginning at midnight if they were to receive Holy Communion.

Clearly, if you wanted to eat on Sunday morning or even have Sunday lunch, you would go to the earliest possible Mass. Most, if not all, would have found it unthinkable to go to Communion at a late Mass on account of the fasting requirement.

However, in 1957, Pope Pius XII reduced the Eucharistic fast to three hours. This opened the possibility for planning to receive Communion at a later Mass, even at an evening Mass, especially for people forced to work on Sunday mornings.

In the 1960s, some European dioceses requested permission for Saturday evening Masses that would fulfill the Sunday obligation, which the Holy See granted. In the United States, our bishops asked for and received permission for Saturday evening Masses in the 1970s. Now the Vatican permission is inscribed in the current Code of Canon Law (#1248).

People have claimed that the Saturday evening Mass was permitted because we have inherited the Jewish practice of celebrating the beginning of a day on the previous evening. The apologist, John Grondelski, maintains that the Saturday evening Mass permission from Rome had nothing to do with Jewish reckoning of time. Instead, it was merely a legal decision.

In fact, according to Tunink, when Saturday evening Masses began, they were called anticipated Masses. They are not truly "vigil" Masses. A vigil Mass actually refers to what Grondelski calls a "self-contained liturgy." The most obvious example is the Easter Vigil, the mother of all (true) vigils. It is self-contained in that it has its own set of Scripture readings and Mass prayers that differ from those of Easter Sunday. The same happens with the Pentecost Vigil.

Likewise, there are true vigil Masses to celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, the Nativity of our Lord, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Nativity of St. John the Baptist and the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. Other solemn feast days, like Sundays, may have anticipated Masses the evening before.

The difference between a vigil and an anticipated Mass is more than semantics. Words matter. Even if this is not the most pressing distinction needed in the Church, it is important because of what a true vigil represents.

Grondelski points out that when the Holy See permitted anticipated Sunday Masses, it was concerned that we not dilute the preeminence of Sunday itself. Sunday is the Lord's Day because on it He rose from the dead in order to re-create us. The danger is that people use the anticipated Mass to "get Mass out of the way." Sunday then becomes a day to do whatever I want rather than to keep holy the Lord's day, as God tells us in the Third Commandment. Recreational activity is not forbidden, but must find its proper place after the worship of God on Sunday.




