It's great to be home after 10 days in Europe, full of many graces of the Jubilee Year. Our time in Rome included walking through the Holy Doors of all four major basilicas, and a general audience with Pope Leo XIV on Wednesday, September 24th. Then in Lourdes and Fatima, our pilgrims took part in their nightly candlelight Rosary processions, which were truly moving experiences. I received a great blessing in Fatima, as I was asked to lead the fourth decade of the Rosary in English on behalf of all the English-speaking pilgrims, so that was a special gift! This was on the same day that a number of our parishioners gathered with the Dominicans in Washington, D.C. for the third annual Dominican Rosary Pilgrimage.

I must say, after making visits to Lourdes and Fatima, my own devotion and fervor for the Rosary has intensified! I hope this is true for those who were on the European pilgrimage, as well as those who attended the Dominican Rosary Pilgrimage. While everyone may not be able to go to Lourdes, Fatima, or Washington, we have our own way of celebrating the Rosary here at St. Patrick's, with this weekend's observance of Rosary Sunday. Blessed roses will be distributed by the friars after all Masses this weekend. Following our Noon Mass, we will have our own Rosary Procession, carrying Our Lady into the streets as we meditate on the mysteries of the Lord's glory. It's our own little way of bringing Lourdes and Fatima to our parish!

In Pope Leo's address during the general audience that our pilgrimage group attended, he reminded those gathered that "the month of October is now approaching, and in the Church it is dedicated in a special way to the Holy Rosary." He went on to say, "I invite everyone, every day of the coming month, to pray the Rosary for peace: personally, in the family, in the community." If you haven't been praying the Rosary daily during the opening days of October, I invite you to follow the Holy Father's invitation and join in the Rosary for peace. How important this is, especially after the September we experienced. With the shooting at Annunciation Catholic Church in Minneapolis, followed by the brutal murder of Charlie Kirk, who was an ardent defender of Christianity in his political debates, I know that many people of faith have been frightened. There seems to be a greater struggle than ever between the forces of good and evil in our society. What will happen next?

In the midst of fear, we have great spiritual weapons to help us. If September was a month of terrible violence, it was also the month of Padre Pio's feast day, he who reminded us to "pray, hope, and don't worry." We celebrated the feast of the archangels at the end of the month, and marked one year of reciting the prayer to St. Michael after Mass here at St. Patrick's. Now we enter the month of the Rosary, and Pope Leo's invitation to pray the Rosary for peace. Yes, there may be things that alarm and frighten us happening in society. But we believe that Christ is victorious, that He who died now lives forever. He does not leave His Church alone, but gives His followers His own Mother, as well as the intercession of the angels and saints to assist us. These spiritual benefits are far greater than any harm that may be directed against people of faith. May God watch over us, and may Our Lady of the Rosary keep us safe under her mantle of protection.



2026 PASTORAL COUNCIL NOMINATIONS

Prayerfully consider nominating yourself or a fellow parishioner to serve on the St. Patrick Church Pastoral Council. Nominees must be at least 19 years of age and permanently living in the greater Columbus area. Representatives on the Pastoral Council advise the pastor on important matters, facilitate communication between the pastor and parishioners, and sponsor several parish events throughout the year. In this Council, which is presided over by the pastor, "the Christian faithful, together with those who share in pastoral care by virtue of their office in the parish, assist in fostering pastoral activity" (Code of Canon Law 536.1). The Pastoral Council collaborates with the pastor to support the spiritual, social, and service goals of the parish. The Pastoral Council is strictly consultative in nature, and is regulated by the norms laid down by the diocesan bishop (Code of Canon Law 536.2).

One (1) position on Pastoral Council will be open for the upcoming year, 2026. This position will fill the vacancy of a councilor who is fulfilling her term.

Parishioners are invited to submit their own name or the name of another parishioner whom you feel would be a good candidate. (Before nominating someone, please ask for his or her permission.) All nominees must be registered members of St. Patrick Church. All nominees will be contacted to discuss the responsibilities and to answer questions.

There are no elections. With hopes for a significant number of nominations, the pastor will select the new councilor from among the nominees after prayerful deliberation, and consultation with the parochial vicars and the members of the nomination committee.

The council typically meets on the second Tuesday of the month (except July and August) from 7:00pm-8:30pm. Members serve a three-year term, which may be renewed for a second consecutive term.








OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH






