This is a weekend to celebrate! We are grateful for the canonizations of two lay Dominicans: St. Pier Giorgio Frassati and St. Bartolo Longo. As a Dominican parish, this is a moment of unique importance for us, and we have much to learn from their lives and witness. On Friday evening, we had a special visit from Bishop Fernandes for a Eucharistic holy hour and Solemn Vespers, and this weekend, we are pleased to welcome Fr. Gabriel Torretta, O.P., as the preacher at all Masses. Father Gabriel is very devoted to these two saints, and he is eager to share his knowledge of their lives with our parish throughout this weekend. I am grateful for the Bishop and Fr. Gabriel's presence here, as well as the work of several parish ministries: the Columbus Frassati Society, the Rosary Confraternity, the Lay Dominicans of St. Dominic, and the St. Patrick Youth Ministry, who are sponsoring their annual fundraiser, Meatfest, this Sunday. I reached out to these particular ministries for the planning of this weekend, since they all have a special connection or patronage to these two saints. They have been most helpful in making this parish-wide celebration possible, and I am grateful for their help and support. Thank you as well to our volunteers on Friday evening, and those who contributed to the "Pizza and Potluck."

One interesting thing to note about St. Pier Giorgio Frassati and St. Bartolo Longo is that they were laymen. Neither were ordained priests, nor were they in religious vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. As lay Dominicans, they made promises to live according to the spirit of St. Dominic, but according to their state in life. Our parish is blessed to host a vibrant chapter of the Lay Fraternities of St. Dominic, which continues to live out this vocation right here at St. Patrick's and in the greater Columbus area. The Lay Dominicans meet on the second Sunday of every month after the Noon Mass. However, not everyone may be called to become a member of the Lay Dominicans, which has its own requirements and commitments. Nevertheless, all members of the laity are called to build up the Church in their own way. This may involve some form of apostolate in the community, but usually, this work happens in the parish.

For the laymen and women who make up our parish community, we can learn from the example of these new saints: that all of us can contribute to the life of the parish in some form or another. As we soon move into November, our Pastoral Council will be sponsoring our Ministry Fair on the weekend of November 15-16. This is a great opportunity to meet representatives from all our parish ministries and learn about ways you can get more

involved in the life of the parish. I encourage each and every one of you to go to the Fair and learn more. Members of our Pastoral Council are also looking to form a group of parish volunteers, called the *Fiat Team*, who won't necessarily be committed to a specific ministry, but who will be available to help with various events whenever there is a need for volunteers. *Fiat* comes from Our Lady's words: "Let it be done to me according to your word." It's Mary's "yes." For all members of our parish – YES! There is a way that you can help!

2026 PASTORAL COUNCIL NOMINATIONS

Prayerfully consider nominating yourself or a fellow parishioner to serve on the St. Patrick Church Pastoral Council. Nominees must be at least 19 years of age and permanently living in the greater Columbus area. Representatives on the Pastoral Council advise the pastor on important matters, facilitate communication between the pastor and parishioners, and sponsor several parish events throughout the year. In this Council, which is presided over by the pastor, "the Christian faithful, together with those who share in pastoral care by virtue of their office in the parish, assist in fostering pastoral activity" (Code of Canon Law 536.1). The Pastoral Council collaborates with the pastor to support the spiritual, social, and service goals of the parish. The Pastoral Council is strictly consultative in nature, and is regulated by the norms laid down by the diocesan bishop (Code of Canon Law 536.2).

One (1) position on Pastoral Council will be open for the upcoming year, 2026. This position will fill the vacancy of a councilor who is fulfilling her term.

Parishioners are invited to submit their own name or the name of another parishioner whom you feel would be a good candidate. (Before nominating someone, please ask for his or her permission.) All nominees must be registered members of St. Patrick Church. All nominees will be contacted to discuss the responsibilities and to answer questions.

There are no elections. With hopes for a significant number of nominations, the pastor will select the new councilor from among the nominees after prayerful deliberation, and consultation with the parochial vicars and the members of the nomination committee.

The council typically meets on the second Tuesday of the month (except July and August) from 7:00pm-8:30pm. Members serve a three-year terms, which may be renewed for a second consecutive term.

LITURGICAL CORNER: THE CATAFALQUE

This year, we have the rare opportunity of celebrating the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day) on a Sunday. The Mass for All Souls will replace the Mass for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time, and the priest will wear black vestments. A new custom that we will begin this year at St. Patrick's is the placing of the catafalque at the foot of the sanctuary, over the Dominican shield. Historically, a catafalque is an ornate stand for holding a casket during a funeral Mass. Over time, it became customary in the traditional celebration of the liturgy to have a catafalque at all Masses for the Dead, even if it wasn't a funeral and no body of the deceased was present. An empty casket (or box), draped in the funeral pall, would serve as a reminder of death ("Frater, Memento Mori."), a reality that we all must face. For many years, we have brought the reliquary down to the floor for veneration on All Saints' Day, supported on two wooden pillars. Beginning this year, the pillars will remain for All Souls' Day, but the reliquary will be replaced with an empty box draped in the funeral pall, surrounded by six candles, creating our own catafalque. This will hopefully serve as a powerful symbol of the mysteries we celebrate on All Saints' Day (the Church triumphant) and All Souls' Day (the Church suffering). It will also be a visible reminder for everyone to prepare for our own coming death. Parents can also use this as an opportunity to teach their children about the importance of praying for the dead, and our belief in the resurrection of the body, as children will certainly have questions about this unique display in the church on All Souls' Day.



REMINDER ON PARKING IN COLUMBUS STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE LOTS

As you know, St. Patrick Church owns the parking lot immediately behind, to the east of, the Priory. The parking lots adjacent to ours and across Grant Avenue belong to **Columbus State Community College.** During most of the week, those wishing to park in Columbus State lots must pay using a smartphone app, QR code, or

text message or risk a \$75.00 fine.

Two years ago, we entered into an arrangement with CSCC wherein we pay rent for use of their two lots for Sunday Masses, Holy Day Masses, and occasional events. We indicate those times with signs which say, "Church Parking Only." When you see

those signs, and ONLY when you see those signs, you may park at no charge in those Columbus State parking lots.

The CSCC parking lot management company has recently been ticketing parishioners attending weekday Mass. Please pay attention, and if you park in CSCC lots at other than the times displaying "Church Parking Only" signs, be prepared to pay.



INDULGENCES FOR JUBILEE YEAR 2025

A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ to remove the temporal punishment due to sin.

The indulgence applies to sins already forgiven. A plenary indulgence cleanses the soul as if the person had just been baptized. Plenary indulgences obtained during the Jubilee Year can also be applied to souls in purgatory with the possibility of obtaining two plenary indulgences for the deceased in one day.

To obtain an indulgence, the usual conditions of detachment from all sin, sacramental confession, holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope must be met (usually, an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be).

- I. Make a Pilgrimage to Rome and pray for the Pope's intentions in any one of the Four Major Papal Basilicas (St. Peter's Basilica, the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, or St. Paul Outside the Walls) or any of the special Jubilee churches listed by the Apostolic penitentiary in Rome
- II. Make a pilgrimage to one of the following churches in Italy: Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi, Basilica of Our Lady of the Angels in Assisi, Basilica of Our Lady of Loreto, Basilica of Our Lady of Pompeii, Basilica of St. Anthony in Padua, OR in the Holy Land: Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem, Basilica of the Nativity in Bethlehem, Basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth
- III. Perform an extraordinary work of mercy such as a generous gift to the poor, or visiting nursing homes or prisons
- IV. Participate in diocesan or parish sponsored spiritual exercises, missions, or formation activities based on the documents of the Second Vatican Council or the Catechism of the Catholic Church
- V. Visit any local Cathedral, Marian Shrine, or other special church designated by the local bishop for obtaining the Jubilee Indulgence
- VI. Fasting at least one day a week from "futile distractions" such as social media, television, video games, certain phone apps




