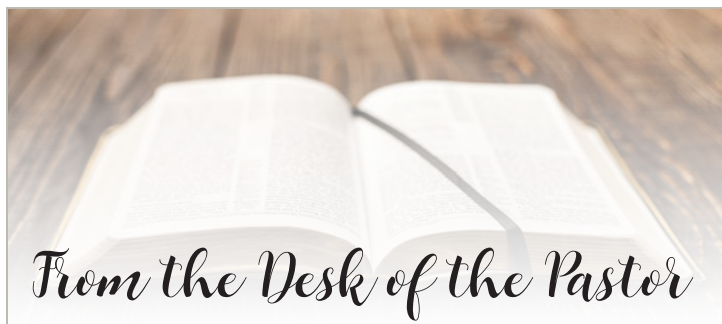

Today, the Church remembers all the faithful departed – All Souls’ Day. If you have lost a loved one over the past year, this day may be particularly somber (as customary at St. Patrick’s, the names of parishioners who have died over the past year will be kept in the sanctuary all month). We pray for the dead, asking God to deliver the souls of the faithful departed from any temporal punishment they may be enduring in purgatory, and to bring them into the glory of heaven.

So often today, there is a tendency to brush aside our customs or practices related to death. In many places, funerals become opportunities to remember the person, but without praying for his or her soul. Liturgically, some shift the focus of funerals to the resurrection of the dead, but miss the reality of the four last things: death, judgment, heaven, and hell. Purgatory is a dogma of our faith, and we don’t know how long a person must experience purification before entering eternal bliss with God. And so we pray for the dead, with prayers like the “Eternal rest...”, visits to cemeteries, and the offering of Masses for the souls of the faithful departed. Today at Mass, you will see the priest vested in black. While we do indeed believe in the resurrection of the dead (signified by white vestments), we need to mourn first (which is why we wear black).

This year, we will also see the addition of the catafalque before the sanctuary gates, which I hope becomes an All Souls’ Day custom at St. Patrick’s. Though no body will be present, it will be placed on the spot where the casket is placed for funerals. As we gaze upon the catafalque at Mass today, it should serve as a stark reminder for everyone: “memento mori,” translated as: “remember your death.” Whether we like it or not, death is coming for all of us. It is the great equalizer – king and peasant, pope and layman, the influential and the forgotten – death is a reality that we all must face. Will we be ready? We know neither the day nor the hour of our death, which is why it is so important to stay in a state of grace at all times. Build a relationship with God now on earth, so that He doesn’t seem unfamiliar to us when we meet Him at our particular judgment. Talking about death may seem morbid for our culture, but for people of faith, it is putting things in right order: we live for Christ now, so that after death, we may be with Him for all eternity.

While All Souls’ Day is the primary day for remembering the dead, a plenary indulgence is available (under the usual conditions) between today and November 9th for visiting a Catholic cemetery and praying for the faithful departed. Even if you can’t make a visit to a cemetery throughout this week, it is a good and noble

thing to visit a cemetery during the month of November and remember the dead.

On a personal note, a few weeks ago, I celebrated my 40th birthday. I received so many cards, spiritual bouquets, well wishes and gifts. In case I forgot anyone or didn’t thank them properly, I wanted to offer a word of thanks for remembering me on my birthday. I am truly grateful!

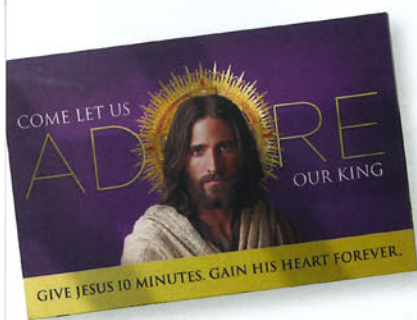

SERRA CLUBS LAUNCH 'ADORE' TO LINK ADORATION & VOCATIONS

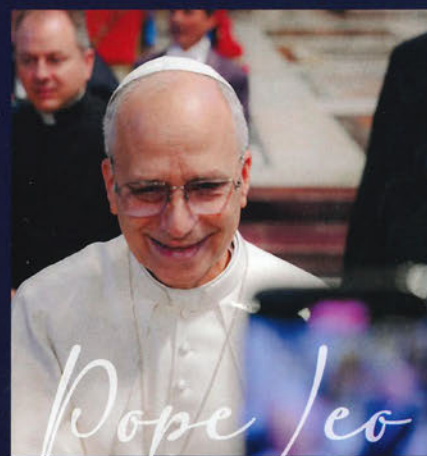
“We hear a lot about holy hours, but many people feel they don’t have an hour, or even a half-hour,” said Margo Geddie, the president-elect of Serra International, the Church’s official apostolate to promote vocations. “We feel it’s important to encourage people to spend any amount of time—even just ten minutes—visiting Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. I know for me, it’s been life-changing.”



Why did Serra undertake this project? “It’s really pretty simple,” said Margo, “For years we’ve seen the link between vocations and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Go to any youth conference, and you can see the enthusiasm, the incredible graces being poured out during Adoration. And these are the same students who are answering the call, entering seminaries and convents.

So we thought if we can promote Adoration on the local level, we’re also promoting vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life.”

Of course, “making a visit” has long been a traditional devotion for Catholics, young and old alike. “We also want to encourage older people to say a quick prayer for vocations whenever they’re in the chapel,” said Margo. “Jesus told us we should beg for what we need—and every Catholic knows we need more sisters and priests.”

ADVICE TO SEMINARIANS

“Do not think of yourselves as alone, nor by yourselves,” said Pope Leo to seminarians in Rome this summer. He quoted a Church document on priestly formation, saying, “Each one of you is the protagonist of his own formation... but protagonist does not mean *soloist*! Therefore, I invite you always to cultivate communion, first of all with your seminary companions... Finally, the most important thing: keep your eyes fixed on Jesus, cultivating the relationship of friendship with Him.”

DISCERNMENT MEN DISCERN ON 'THE WAY'

If you've seen Martin Sheen's movie "The Way," you know that many pilgrims who walk Spain's famous Camino begin with a certain goal in mind, but end up receiving far more than they ever imagined.

That was the idea behind the "Discernment Camino" led by Fr. George Sears, the Vocation Director for the Archdiocese of New York. He and a brother priest led four seminarians and nine young men on a 14-day trek across the Spanish countryside, ending at Santiago de Compostela.

"It was an absolutely amazing experience," said Fr. Sears. "Every one of the men built camaraderie and grew closer to the Lord. And at least two of them are excited about applying to seminary next year."

The archdiocese recently made headlines with their "Called by Name" campaign, which identified more than 800 faithful young men. While Fr. Sears can't accompany all of them on the Camino, his Vocation Team has a solid plan to help them begin their own journey to discern God's call.

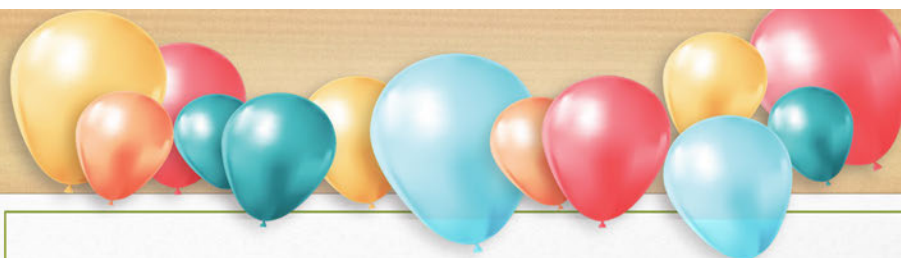
