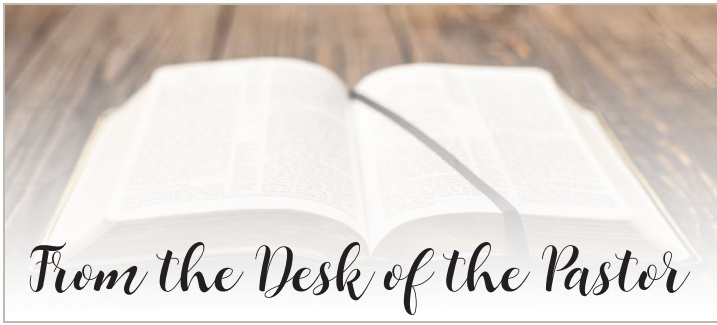

Today is the beginning of National Vocations Awareness Week. We are pleased to welcome two diocesan seminarians from our parish – Collin Gosche and Hans Zehnder – who will be speaking before all Masses on behalf of this weekend’s second collection, the Seminarian Support Fund. Both Collin and Hans are in their propaedeutic year, the initial year of formation for our diocesan seminarians (Collin is assigned to Mount St. Mary’s of the West Seminary in Cincinnati, and Hans is in town at the Pontifical College Josephinum).

This year has been a time of particular blessing for our parish and vocations to the priesthood. Back in May, we were overjoyed at the ordination of two sons of our parish, Fr. Tyler Carter and Fr. Michael Haemmerle, and their glorious first Masses offered in our beautiful church. They are now serving the Diocese of Columbus as priests, but our number of diocesan seminarians from the parish has not decreased - the Lord has blessed us with Collin and Hans’s entrance into the seminary, as they join Shane Gerrity and Shawn Caslow as diocesan seminarians from our parish. Are there more future seminarians out there?

I certainly think so! Right now in the parish, we have a group of high school boys who meet once a month for the *Melchizedek Project*, a program designed for young men to help them discern whether they have a vocation to the Priesthood. This is the second year of the program (and Hans was part of our first group that met last year!). Another important activity that can encourage a priestly vocation is serving at the altar. At St. Patrick, we are blessed with an incredible Altar Boy Program – 76 boys in total this year from Grades 5-12. Last weekend, we wrapped up an intense round of altar boy trainings, and our new Acolytes and head servers did exceptionally well (so did our four Altar Boy Deans, who trained them!). So many priests recount finding their vocation from the experience of serving at the Altar, and drawing closer to our Lord in the Eucharist because of it. Maybe the Lord is calling some of these boys to serve the Church as priests one day? As we give thanks for our altar boys and their service to the parish, I invite everyone to join us for the Installation of New Altar Boys next Sunday at the 9:00 a.m. Mass, when the new Acolytes and new head servers will receive a special blessing.

As this week begins, pray for vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life, and pray for strong and holy marriages. And if you know anyone who you think may have a vocation

(whether from our parish or elsewhere), don’t be afraid to offer a word of encouragement. When I was a freshman in high school, it was one of the faithful volunteers in my home parish who asked me at a Lenten Fish Fry: “when are you going to be a priest?” Maybe the Lord is using you to ask something similar to one of our young people!

On a final note – remember that Tuesday is Election Day. As faithful Catholics living in a secular country, don’t be afraid to make your voice heard at the ballot box (if you haven’t already done so through early voting). On Election Day, go and vote! God bless you,

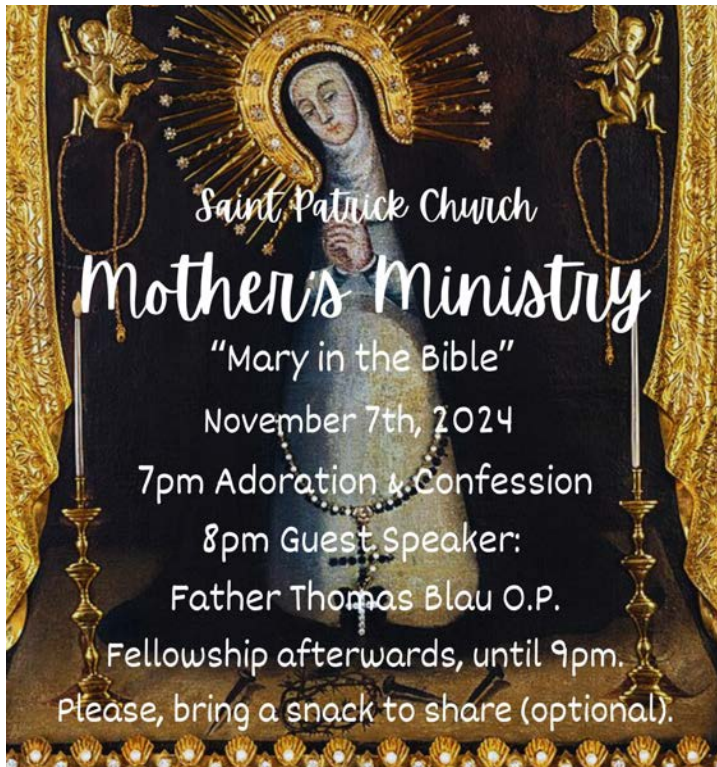

FATHER RYAN STAWAISZ HEROIC SERVICE IN HIS FINAL DAYS

Shortly before his ordination, Ryan Stawaisz received a devastating cancer diagnosis—his second one after successfully beating cancer as a junior in college.

Despite his diagnosis, Fr. Ryan began his priestly ministry at Prince of Peace in Houston in 2019. Just two years later, on June 21, 2021, the young priest passed away, leaving a lasting impact on his parishioners, many of whom attested to his tremendous witness.

Those who knew Fr. Ryan were deeply touched by his selfless ministry, even in his final days as a priest—so much so that he has inspired a film about his life.

His brother Ross Stawaisz says he hopes Fr. Ryan's story will show the "need to stand up for some things. You need to live your life in a way that emulates Christ."

Fr. Ryan's mother, Susan Stawaisz, said she has heard from several cancer patients on how the movie has touched them: "I feel like anybody who's gone through any kind of suffering can relate to offering up your suffering and suffering heroically."

In the months leading up to the National Eucharistic Congress, Serra International raised more than \$150,000 to sponsor the presence of more than 50 religious communities.

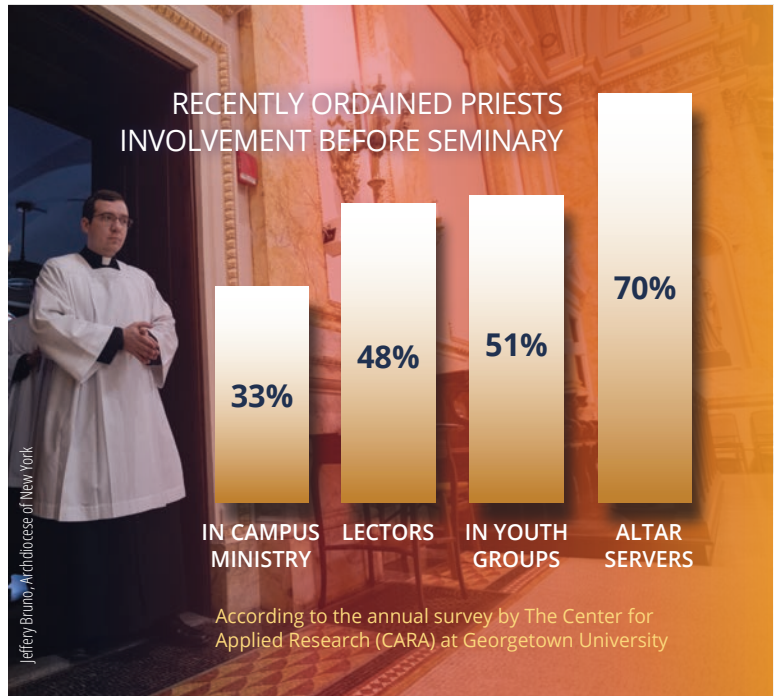

RECENTLY ORDAINED PRIESTS ORIGINS *of* PRIESTHOOD

Pope Francis has emphasized that seminarians must be “men of communion” who arise organically from the communities they serve, then return after seminary to minister even more profoundly.

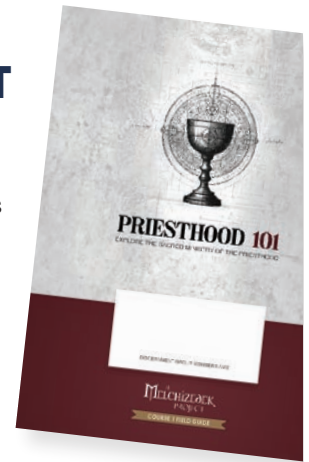
That vision is slowly becoming a reality in the U.S., with most of the priests ordained in 2024 reporting active involvement in their parishes and schools.

According to CARA’s recent study of men ordained in 2024, the average age at which they first considered the priesthood was 16. Between 32% and 42% went to a Catholic elementary school, high school, or college. About 60% obtained college degrees before seminary, and 70% had full-time work experience. A full 75% reported regularly participating in Eucharistic Adoration before entering priestly formation.



SMALL GROUPS DEEP DISCERNMENT

The Melchizedek Project, a long-standing program that starts priesthood discernment groups for young men, was re-launched this summer with a new format. It’s now easier to start and run the group, with robust leader training and excellent videos that spark discussion. Want to help your parish priest start a group? FATHER-SON SEMINARY TRIP

“I dream of a day when young men enter seminary, not *looking* for a father, but having been *brought* by their fathers,” said Deacon James Keating of Omaha, who is renowned for his work in priestly formation.

About 45% of seminarians say they were discouraged by a friend or family member from considering the priesthood. And while some parents are tentatively open to the idea, many aren’t thrilled about it.

But a real revival of a “vocations culture” requires that parents actively encourage their sons and daughters to seriously consider priesthood and religious life. Think about it this way: just as you would take your teen son to visit prospective colleges, why not try to arrange a visit to a seminary?

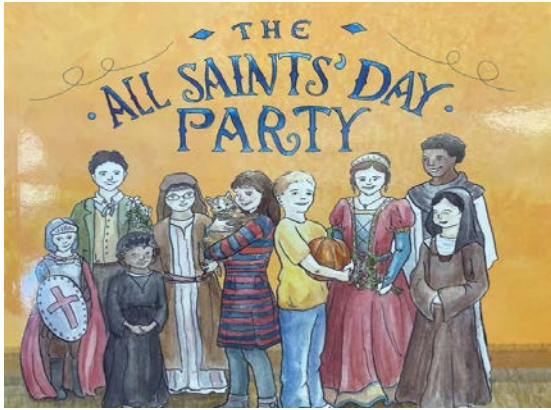

We are off to a good start with 222 pledges totaling \$145,605.01 thus far toward our parish goal of \$153,636.

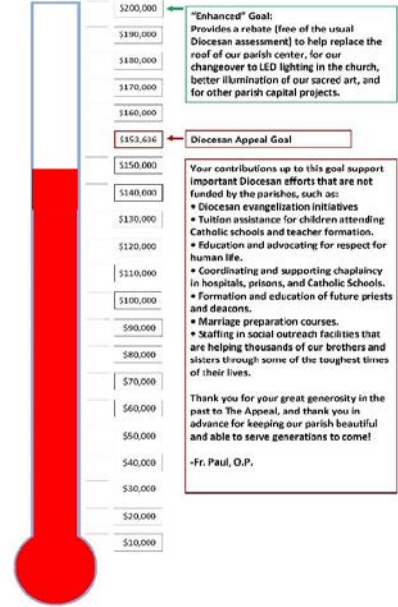
