In late September, Fr. Stephen Dominic Hayes completed his three-year term as prior, and since then, the Dominican community at St. Patrick Priory began the process for electing a new prior. A prior can be elected from within the community here, or can be chosen from friars assigned throughout the Province. On November 5th, we met to elect a new prior - and I got elected! This means that in addition to my service as your pastor, I am now the religious superior of all the friars at the priory.

The prior serves as a religious superior of a local Dominican community for a three-year term, and is responsible for the care and needs of the friars in the house, while also overseeing the overall trajectory of the ministries of our community. While half of the friars at St. Patrick's serve in the parish (myself, Fr. Michael Donahue, Fr. Cornelius Avaritt, and Fr. Edmund Ditton), the other half take part in outside apostolates, with Fr. Paul Keller's work in the Office of Divine Worship for the Diocese of Columbus and Fr. Thomas Blau's ministry at the Ohio State Newman Center and covering throughout the Diocese. Father Juan Macias Marquez is a hospital chaplain not only at Riverside, but now at Ohio State as well. Father Hayes will continue to reside here, and now has more time dedicated to his mission and retreat preaching, and helping out with coverage throughout the Diocese. We are certainly an active and vibrant community with many apostolates. Historically, a Dominican priory has been called "the holy preaching," since preaching is not so much about what we do, but who we are as Dominicans.

Long-term, being the prior doesn't interfere or affect my assignment as your pastor. For over a century, before St. Patrick's became a priory, the pastor also served as the superior of the community, though this was an appointed position by the Provincial (whereas a prior is elected by the friars, and confirmed by the Provincial). When St. Patrick's was elevated to a priory in 2017, Fr. Stephen Alcott served in both roles for three years, until his three-year term ended (and he remained as pastor for four more years before being called upon for a new assignment). The last two priors were not the pastor of the parish, nor assigned to the parish staff, though they helped out on occasion. Now we return to this arrangement where one friar has both offices of pastor and prior. I may have to attend more meetings over the next three years (including the Provincial Chapter in Providence, Rhode Island in June, which will take me away for at least two weeks), and I am also responsible for the elderly friars at Mohun Hall and Mother Angeline McCrory Manor. But I am certainly

grateful for this new office, and I am humbled that the friars and the Provincial put their confidence in me. Please pray for me twice now, as I serve in the offices of both pastor and prior!

Speaking of the Provincial, we are happy to welcome him here this weekend. Father Allen Moran has served as the Provincial of the Dominican Province of St. Joseph since 2023, and he is visiting our priory this week, which he is required to do during his term of office. Father Allen will be celebrating the 9:00 a.m. Mass this weekend, and will be checking in on our Ministry Fair. He'll also bring along any of your greetings to our former pastor, Fr. Michael Dosch, who is his right-hand man in New York!

This weekend, our Pastoral Council will be sponsoring our annual Ministry Fair in Patrick Hall after all Masses. I encourage all of you to stop in and visit, and learn about the many ways you can get involved and help in our wonderful parish!




