Congratulations to Fr. Tyler Carter and Fr. Michael Haemmerle; the Holy Spirit breathes the fragrance of courage, mercy, strength, and hope.

Dear friends,

First of all, congratulations to our newly ordained priests, Fr. Tyler Carter and Fr. Michael Haemmerle! Today they are each celebrating a Mass of Thanksgiving at St. Patrick. Every Mass is a solemn act of thanksgiving to God, of course. Fr. Carter and Fr. Haemmerle are also giving thanks to you, the people of St. Patrick Parish, for your support of them as they grew up in our parish. Please continue to support them with your prayers as they begin their ministry as priests!

Today, on Pentecost, we ask the Holy Spirit to breathe into us courage, mercy, strength, and hope.

Imagine being in a small, poorly lit room.

One loses track of what is going on outside of this closed in, immediate world. Things that are really not that significant appear to be so. We gradually become accustomed to the staleness of the air and dimness of the shadows.

And then, a window or a door is opened to the outdoors. Fresh air comes in; light comes in; shadows are driven away. We become aware that we are part of something bigger.

This is what the Holy Spirit does for the apostles; and this is what the Holy Spirit does for us. As we said in our Psalm response today: Lord, send forth your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.

Here are three similar scenes worthy of reflection:

I reflect on the scene that Jesus enters in our Gospel passage.

The disciples are behind locked doors, because of fear that they will suffer the same fate as Jesus. There is an atmosphere of:

- Guilt: they fled from Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, despite their professions of courage at the Last Supper.
- Weakness: they do not know how to go forward without Jesus. Fearful, and gathered behind closed doors, the disciples are left without their friend and teacher.
- Despair: they saw Jesus die on the cross, and though some of the women claim to have seen him, they have not.

When they are humbled by their weakness and their fear, Jesus comes to them, breaking through their defenses, and breathes new life into them. It is into this atmosphere that Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit - and the disciples rejoice. This is the giving of the Spirit in the Gospel of John; this is the equivalent of Pentecost.

The fear gives way to courage; the guilt is swept away by mercy and the power to forgive; the weakness and sense of

abandonment is swept away by the presence of the Lord; and despair is swept away by hope and faith in his victory over sin and death.

II. Reflect on the scene of the Cross in John's Gospel.

Here again, Jesus faces a scene overshadowed by fear, sin, weakness, and despair. And his last act upon the cross—at the same time his hour of greatest suffering and greatest Lordship—is to hand over, to breathe his Spirit.

III. Reflect on one other scene a week before the scene of the Cross: a meal at Bethany with Lazarus, Martha, and Mary. Mary pours out a pound of precious, fragrant ointment costing 300 days wages.

Here there is the foreboding of Jesus' prediction that he will be handed over, condemned, suffer, die, and only then rise. There is a foreboding of the treachery of Judas in his protest against the anointing (for selfish reasons). Jesus alludes to his own burial as the point of this outpouring of love.

Yet the fragrance of this gift fills the room. It is perhaps a sign of hope in his resurrection: some strands of Judaism at the time believed that anointing the bodies of the dead was on par with alms for the poor, as the anointing was a condition for resurrection. It is definitely an outpouring of love, of what is most precious, and an outpouring of self with no regard for oneself (Mary dries his feet with her hair).

We can learn from this gift of Mary. We too are given a precious gift (worth far more than 300 days wages): the Holy Spirit, who comes to dwell in our soul at baptism and pours out his gifts upon us as we are strengthened at Confirmation.

We can "break open" this gift by asking the Holy Spirit to breathe into our fear, weakness, guilt, despair, and bring strength and joy; to overcome our shadows with a fragrance of joy and hope.

We read in the Book of Genesis that God breathed into the first man the breath of life, and this man became a living being. Here in the Gospel of John, God breathes into these living apostles the Spirit who will make them holy, the Spirit who will draw them into the life of God in friendship.

The work of the Holy Spirit is to make us holy; that is, to make us closer to God. The goal: that we might share in the inmost life of God.

And I tell you: Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him! (Luke 11:9-13)

We can ask the Holy Spirit to breathe strength, mercy, hope, and joy into our lives, seeking this great gift of the Father, who brings great gifts and helps us bear the fruits of his presence.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit are: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

The fruits of the Holy Spirit; the signs that point to the Holy Spirit at work in us, are: charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity.

Just before the Gospel today, we heard the Pentecost sequence: a poetic prayer inviting the Holy Spirit to come to our help.

Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home Shed a ray of light divine!

Come, Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store! Come, within our bosoms shine!

We may not naturally speak in such poetic language, but to God, all prayer spoken from the heart is as beautiful and effective as any poetry.

So, ask for the Holy Spirit to guide you. And watch and wait for the answer.

"Holy Spirit, open the doors of the stale, shadowy place in which I've closed myself."

"Holy Spirit, help me know the right thing to say to console my friend."

"Holy Spirit, touch my child's heart so that she will know how much she is loved by God."

"Holy Spirit, shed some light on this difficult decision I need to make."

"Holy Spirit, help me find some time to pray today."

"Holy Spirit, help me to understand my faith better, and help me resolve the doubts that I have."

"Holy Spirit, help me to confess my sins, so that I may be forgiven and set free."

"Holy Spirit, bring my heart peace."

These little prayers, prayed from the heart, can work wonders. Jesus did not leave us on our own when he returned to his Father in heaven. He gave us the Holy Spirit, the greatest gift and greatest friend we could ever have. Yet if we want to find his help, we should seek his help with all our heart.

And every time we pray to the Holy Spirit, he opens the door to a bigger, brighter, truer life.






