Kickoff weekend for The Appeal 2024; Calling all Columbus State Students; Love with the Heart of Jesus; Pray for our First Communicants

Dear friends,

Today is the kickoff for The Appeal 2024 for our Diocese of Columbus. Our theme for 2024 is "Respond to His Love," which connects to our present Jubilee Year of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We can never repay the Lord for the infinite mercy and divine life that flows to us from his Sacred Heart, but we can show our generosity to him in our brothers and sisters, especially those who represent Christ and those who need a deeper relationship with Christ. The four key ministries to be supported in The Appeal 2024 are:

- **Evangelization:** Supporting families, parishes, and schools in missionary disciple formation is vital to fostering evangelization. This helps extend the reach of Christ's mercy and divine life to those who do not know him yet.
- Catholic Education & Tuition Assistance: Catholic schools are a ministry of the Church and lay the foundation for evangelization. Bishop Fernandes, with the help of Superintendent Adam DuFault and two of our Dominican sisters, Sister Andrea Andrzejewska, O.P. and Sister John Paul Maher, O.P., are working steadily to strengthen the Catholic identity of our Catholic schools.
- Vocations: The Diocese has been blessed with an increasing number of men discerning a vocation to the priesthood, including some from our own parish. We are looking forward to the ordination to the priesthood of two men from our parish next month: Deacon Tyler Carter and Deacon Michael Haemmerle. The Appeal is one of the key sources of support for the formation of our seminarians.
- Social Needs: Christ told us that whatever we do for the least of our brothers and sisters, we do for him. Appeal funds will directly impact vital work in serving mothers and their children and defending life at every stage and condition. Support will also be provided for the coordination of the prison ministry to serve the spiritual needs of inmates in the twelve correctional facilities in the diocese. The Appeal will help the work of dedicated chaplains as they remind those in hospitals, prisons, and schools of God's presence.

Thank you for your generosity to last year's Appeal. Our 2023 parish goal was \$140,569, and we achieved a new parish record for pledges: \$220,038. This will yield an anticipated refund of \$79,469.

The goal assigned by the Diocese for St. Patrick Parish for The Appeal 2024 is \$153,636.

As always, 100% of funds received over our parish goal will be refunded to St. Patrick Parish, free of the normal Diocesan assessment. For several years, this annual refund has helped us complete key capital projects for our parish, such as replacing our church roof with a new slate roof, helping to rebuild and complete our pipe organ, replacing aging AC compressors in the church and parish center, and

currently working on the changeover to LED lighting for our church, and better illuminating the sacred art in our church.

A key capital project we presently face is the need to replace the roof of our parish center. It is now 20 years old and leaking in places. We are still receiving bids on this project and so do not yet know the total cost, but it will be significant. Your generosity to The Appeal 2024 will help us meet the expense of this important capital project, in addition to helping with key ministries of our Diocese.

Our Gospel passage today follows right after the passage we heard last week about the vine and the branches. These profound and intimate words are spoken by Jesus to the apostles after the Last Supper. They arise from the depths of his heart. At the Last Supper, Jesus instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist, and commanded them to continue to celebrate the Eucharist—a way for him to truly remain with his disciples and for them to remain in his love. Jesus loves them with the divine love he shares with his Father. Jesus wants his own joy to be within them, so that their joy will be complete.

In today's passage, Jesus also calls the disciples his friends. Jesus is preparing to lay down his life for them. His love is that deep - a love unto death. He commands them to love one another with the same love with which he loves them.

How can we, poor sinners that we are, love like this? We cannot possibly love like this on our own. In last week's Gospel passage, in fact, Jesus told his disciples, "Without me, you can do nothing." Unless we are connected to Jesus, as a branch to the trunk of the vine, we can do nothing good. However, when we are connected to him, and his life flows through us, we can bear much fruit and give glory to the Father, extending in our own lives the love of Jesus as his faithful disciples.

We are currently celebrating the Jubilee of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, celebrating the appearance of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque 350 years ago in Paray le Monial, France. The Sacred Heart of Jesus unites the divine and human love of Jesus, who is truly God and truly man. Jesus desires that the saving love from his Sacred Heart would flow into and through us, for the salvation of souls.

In 1956, Pope Pius XII wrote a major encyclical on the Sacred Heart, *Haurietis Aquas* (You Will Draw Waters). He based his encyclical on Isaiah 12:3, "with joy you will draw waters from the wells of salvation" which prophecies to the abundance of the supernatural graces which flow from the heart of Christ. *Haurietis Aquas* called the whole Church to recognize the Sacred Heart as an important dimension of Christian spirituality. The Church gives the highest form of worship to the Heart of Jesus because it is united to the "Person of the Incarnate Son of God Himself" and it is the natural sign and symbol of Jesus' boundless love for mankind. As Pope Benedict XVI said,

"By encouraging devotion to the Heart of Jesus, we encourage believers to open themselves up to the mystery of God and of His love, and to allow themselves to be transformed by it. It is a fitting task for Christians to continue to deepen their relationship with the Heart of Jesus, in such a way as to revive their faith in the saving love of God and to welcome Him into their lives."

The unending river of life and love that flows from the Heart of Jesus into us, his disciples, also flows through us even to those who are difficult to love. Bishop Earl Fernandes wrote in his letter on the Sacred Heart of Jesus in June 2023:

Jesus' words, "Turn the other cheek," "Go the extra mile," and "Love your enemies" are not empty catch phrases. They are the basic expectations for His disciples. From the Cross, He even utters, "Father, forgive them. They do not know what they are doing." Those whom the Heart of the Lord has loved unto its own emptiness—they are worth our pain—their well-being is as important, perhaps, more important, than our happiness and comfort.

How do we rise up to the greatness of this calling, fragile as we are, in the modem world? Jesus says, "I am the Vine; you are the branches. Apart from me you can do nothing." In many ways, our greatest answer to this question is the Eucharist through which we discover that we are loved more than we can ever love, through the constant union of ourselves with the suffering but risen Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

St. Elizabeth of the Trinity says of the Eucharist, "Isn't that a piece of heaven?" We are united with the Jesus through whom we are saved. That union, once free from the shadows of time and human consciousness, is our eternal life. We are almost there each time we approach the altar, each time we consume the Host and drink the Cup, each time we share that with those the Lord has given us to love.

Whenever we approach Jesus in the Eucharist, we are approaching the blazing furnace of life and love, and the limitless source of our own life and love. We can offer this popular prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus then or at any time, asking that he will make our poor hearts a bridge to his:

O most holy Heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore You, I love You, and with a lively sorrow for my sins, I offer You this poor heart of mine. Make me humble, patient, pure, and wholly obedient to Your will. Grant, good Jesus, that I may live in You and for You. Protect me in the midst of danger; comfort me in my afflictions. Give me health of body, assistance in my temporal needs, Your blessing on all that I do, and the grace of a holy death. Amen.

Please remember in your prayers our young people who are preparing for their First Holy Communion this Saturday here at St. Patrick. Ask Jesus that this will root them more deeply into friendship with him, that this will be the first of many Holy Communions as his faithful disciples, and that they will have his joy within them, so that their joy may be complete.



Catholics for Life, Greater Columbus Right to Life, and other ministries can provide training, literature, signs, and shadowing opportunities.
